INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

DFS Mobile Extraction Unit

The Massachusetts Department of Fire Services has placed a new "Mobile Extraction Unit" (MEU) used to clean the PPE of the instructors and recruit firefighters and reduce exposure at all three MFA campuses. The truck is a 2021 Peterbilt with a cargo type body. The unit was outfitted by Red Line Gear Cleaning of Marlborough and includes two extractors, a tumble dryer, two drying cabinets and an ultrasonic cleaner for tools and SCBA brackets. The unit's water supply is self contained in two 599 gallon tanks for clean and contaminated water. It is estimated the MEU can clean up to forty sets of PPE.

This unit will be housed in Stow and will be available for communities on an emergency basis if a fire department has an incident with a large amount of contaminated PPE. A fire inside a fire station when 4 groups in a multi-company station with two sets of gear each are contaminated could lead to a real challenge for a fire department to quickly return the gear back into service, the MEU would be a great asset in a situation as that.

Funding for this new unit was supplied through the 2019 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG). This MEU will have a major impact on the health & safety of thousands of firefighters throughout the years by providing the ability to clean and dry the PPE of firefighters during training.
