




Following the program, a brief business meeting was conducted. Members adjourned to lunch at Paddy's Public House in West Newton.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER: CNG Bus Fire



Alternative fuel buses are becoming more common on the streets in our communities. Buses using Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) have the storage tanks mounted on the roof of the bus. If the bus strikes a bridge or other low hanging obstacle, it may cause failure of the cylinder.

If a CNG bus is on fire in the coach or drive-train and the cylinders are not exposed, the focus should be to extinguish with normal tactics. HOWEVER, if the cylinders are involved and the pressure relief device (PRD) on the tanks have activated, the recommendation is to <u>NOT</u> apply water to the relief device on the cylinder. Applying water to the area of the PRD on the cylinders may cool the PRD resulting in the relief device not activating. This may produce a catastrophic failure of the cylinder causing them to rocket. Let the PRD do what it is designed to do, release the pressure building inside the cylinder and allow the gas to burn off.

When the PRD activates, it will not close or reset. The gas will burn off violently for up to 10-15 minutes until the cylinder is fully discharged depending on the cylinder size. The PRD's are located at both ends of the cylinder and may be vented upward and sideways. There may also be a PRD on the bottom of the vehicle at the regulator.

ESTABLISH A MINIMUM SAFETY PERIMETER OF 100-FEET AROUND THE VEHICLE, ALWAYS APPROACH FROM A 45-DEGREE ANGLE, DEPLOY ADDITIONAL HOSELINES TO PROTECT EXPOSURERS, ASSIGN POLICE TO EVACUATE CIVILIANS.
