



RECALL OF MEETING #2018-08

The October meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday, October 24, 2018 hosted by the Sharon Fire Department courtesy of Chief James Wright. We met in the Training/EOC Room at the new Sharon Public Safety Complex at 211 South Main St.

The training was arranged by Pat O'Connor of Northeast Rescue with a product demonstration by John Robinson from TNT Tools followed by a presentation by Matt Hunt of Sterling Rope on Firefighter Bail-Out Kits.

Following the training portion, President Roche conducted a brief business meeting with discussions on training events, MFTC updates, elevator updates and other topics related to happenings within the fire service. One new member, Lt. Kaufman from Belmont, was introduced.

Following the business meeting, members were provided with a tour by Captain Michael Madden of Sharon's new fire house designed to include indoor training props. Featured on the apparatus floor is a 3-story rappelling structure with a Denver Window on each level for rescue training as well as a forcible entry prop. The outdoors has a 3000-gallon recycling water cistern for training on drafting operations.

Pediatric Burn Management

BURN MANAGEMENT

Evaluation:

- Findings indicative of inhalation injury include: cyanosis, carbonaceous sputum, facial burn, history of fire in enclosed space, respiratory distress or hoarseness, and altered level of consciousness. Consider associated injuries.
- If inhalation injury suspected or history of fire in enclosed space, 100% oxygen by face mask should be administered; early elective intubation should be considered.
- Determine extent of body surface burn using pediatric Lund & Browder Chart. (adult nomogram is inaccurate for infants and children).

Wound Management:

- In the field, wrap the burn wounds in dry, sterile kerlix and transport as quickly as possible.
- In outlying hospital, wash the wound gently with water and a mild soap to remove debris then wrap with a dry sterile kerlix for transport.
- Do not wrap burn wound with wet dressings.

Fluid Resuscitation:

- All patients with second or third degree burns greater than 10% of their body surface area require IV access.
- Fluid management should begin with a 20 mL/kg bolus of Lactated Ringers solution over 20 - 30 minutes.
- Subsequent fluid management consists of Lactated Ringers solution. The calculated daily maintenance fluid plus 4 mL/kg/percent burn is given over 24 hours. Give half of the 24 hour fluid volume over the first 8 hours and the remaining half over the subsequent 16 hours. First 24 hour fluids are calculated from time of injury.
- Adjust fluids to maintain adequate urine output and hemodynamic stability.
- All patients with greater than 10% burns should have a foley catheter placed.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

NIOSH Firefighter Fatality Report

On August 5, 2014, a volunteer Assistant Chief from the New Castle, IN Fire Department died in the line-of-duty after a roof collapse during a fire in a commercial storage building. Heavy fire was showing through the roof on the B/C-side of the building when the first company arrived. The I.C. ordered the doors on the A-side opened and set an unmanned ground monitor to cool the contents.

A defensive attack was initiated, however, the Assistant Chief and 2 firefighters entered the A-side with a big line to protect equipment including acetylene. Command was unaware of their decision to enter. The fire was already in the overhead truss system likely concealed by the ceiling. When the truss system failed, the ceiling and roof assembly collapsed on the firefighters inside. One firefighter managed to escape, another suffering from a leg fracture managed to crawl under equipment and was rescued by the R.I.T. team. The Assistant Chief died from a broken neck by the collapse.

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Fire departments should ensure that a single, effective incident management system is established with a single, designated incident commander, especially when multiple fire departments respond together.
- Fire departments should ensure that an incident action plan is developed and a risk assessment is performed throughout the incident and the tactics match the conditions encountered.
- Fire departments should ensure offensive actions are not performed in a defensive strategy and enforce clear procedures for strategic mode changes.
- Fire departments should work together to develop mutual aid SOP's for fire ground operations that include incident management, communications, and operations, and train on those procedures.
- Incident commanders should ensure that collapse zones and exclusion zones are established, marked, and enforced on defensive fires and incidents where dangerous or hazardous conditions exist and that a RIT is assigned even on defensive fires.
- Fire departments should ensure that a safety officer is assigned at working structural fires.
