



RECALL OF MEETING #2019-10

The October meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday, October 23, 2019 hosted by the Burlington Fire Department courtesy of Interim Chief Michael Paterson and Captain Andy Connerty. The meeting was held in the training room of Burlington's new Station 2 located at 114 Terrace Hall Ave.

The training was provided by Alicia D'Agostino, Education Program Manager for 15-40 Connection. The program focused on cancer and in particular, firefighter cancer rates where statistics show a much higher rate of certain types of cancer. The main "take home point" is the importance of early detection. This short presentation is probably the most important program that you will attend in your career and is recommend for every firefighter, weather active or retired.



Following the training program, Captain Connerty provided members with a tour of this impressive new firehouse that was designed with training props including a manhole confined space rescue prop and a 3-level stair-tower with standpipe and window rappelling options. Members also got a look at their new Engine 2 that was just delivered.

President Roche opened the meeting by introducing our host, Chief Paterson who offered MIFDI and open invite to use the new training room anytime. He also spoke on current and future happening within the department including upgrading their current EMS service to ALS level. Andy Connerty provided an update from the Mass Fire Training Council. Bob MacKendrick spoke on regulations for the new mobile refueling delivery trucks for vehicles that are now available for people apparently "too busy" to stop at a gas station to fuel their cars. The 50/50 was won by longtime member Ed Williamson. Members adjourned for lunch at Chateau Restaurant in Burlington

Stay safe, I hope to see you in Norwood.



INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

USFA 2018 Firefighter Fatality Report



According to the Firefighter Fatality Report from 2018 complied by the United States Fire Administration, the following is a breakdown from the report;

- 82 Firefighters died while on duty
- 33 Firefighters died from heart attacks
- 42 Firefighters died from activities at an emergency incident
- 30 Firefighters died at a fire scene
- 9 Firefighters died during training activities
- 10 Firefighters died while responding/returning from emergency incidents
- 44 Volunteer Firefighters
- 33 Career Firefighters
- 5 Wildland Firefighters
