

RECALL OF MEETING #501

The <u>501st</u> meeting of MIFDI was held on December 20, 2006 hosted by the Belmont Fire Department courtesy of Chief David L. Frizzell. The meeting was held in the second floor training room at Belmont's impressive new fire headquarters.

The training session was provided by Chief William Middlemiss of the Lexington Fire Department. Chief Middlemiss provided an informative power-point presentation on the gas explosion which occurred in Lexington in November 2005 when a Keyspan sub-contractor inadvertently connected a 60 psig gas main into a 2 psig system. This error led to an explosion which destroyed a historic 2.5 house and created numerous incidents for gas leaks and odors effecting one-third of the community.

Following the presentation, Chief Frizzell provided members with a tour of Belmont's new fire HQ which opened in September. This spacious new facility is also equipped with a few training props including a rappelling area and manhole vaults for confined space rescue training.

The presentation concluded with a brief business meeting held by President Roche. Member John Sullivan of Billerica was recognized and congratulated due to his upcoming retirement. Vice President Brian Belliveau offered a motion to wave the By-Laws and allow President Roche to serve another term as MIFDI President which was voted and accepted. President Roche then asked the members to accept the current slate of MIFDI Officers and Directors to be included to serve another year in their respective positions which was also voted and accepted by the membership. Two new members were introduced, Deputy Chief Thomas Conway from Billerica, and Deputy Chief Philip Cargill of Malden. Training Council member Persson gave an informative update from the Massachusetts Fire Training Council meeting. The meeting adjourned for an enjoyable lunch at nearby Brothers Pizza & Grille in Cushing Sq.

EMS RUN:

What is Conjunctivitis?

Conjunctivitis (also known as pinkeye) is an inflammation of the eyes. It most often is caused by viruses but can also be caused by allergies or bacteria. The whites of the eyes may become pink or red with associated pain or itch as well as producing tears and discharge. In the mornings, the discharge may cause the eyelids to stick together making the eyes difficult to open.

Although conjunctivitis is not dangerous and not considered a medical emergency, it is infectious especially among young children who tend to wipe their eyes and touch everything, seldom washing their hands.

We in the EMS profession may see cases of this illness, especially in day care centers and pre-schools that are crowded with children in close contact with one another. Safe to say that universal precautions are necessary. The child's eyes should be wipes free of any discharge using a clean gauze. The recommended treatment is an antibiotic ointment prescribed by a physician and administered by a parent.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER

"Mayday, Mayday!"

The term MAYDAY is listed as "the International radio/telephone distress signal used by ships and aircraft". In the fire service, MAYDAY signals a firefighter down and it is the most dreaded message a fireground commander will ever hear during command of an incident.

When should a MAYDAY be called? It comes down to six simple words; FALL-COLLAPSE-ALARM-CAUGHT-LOST-TRAPPED.

FALL - In need of assistance to get out.

COLLAPSE - Stairway, roof, floor, etc.

ALARM - Any situation where a P.A.S.S. device needs to be activated; low air, poor conditions, distress.

(Call MAYDAY before you activate PASS)

CAUGHT - Entangled by wires.

LOST - Disoriented, off the line, confused.

TRAPPED - Fire, smoke, heat, debris.

When a MAYDAY is called, ALL non-emergency radio traffic shall cease immediately. All power tools, saws, PPV, generators and other loud noise equipment shall be shut down unless absolutely needed for control of the incident. In some cases, the Deputy Chief's Aide or the Safety Officer may relocate away from the noise of the fireground to listen for communications from the member in distress which often mumbled or garbled if the member is injured. A quick roll-call must be made to determine who is missing and where they were last operating. The R.I.C. Team must be deployed to search for the lost member and a back-up R.I.C. team needs to be staged. Most importantly, the I.C. must gain strict control of the rescue mission to prevent a free-lance search which is an automatic instinct of every firefighter wanting to locate their lost brother. The rush of members willing to attempt a rescue will be difficult to restrain, however, free-lancing firefighters could become additional victims should conditions rapidly deteriorate. Therefore a coordinated effort to locate and rescue the member in distress must be deployed and become the top priority until everyone on the fireground is accounted for.
