



INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

Farewell to a Fire Service Leader by MIFDI President Mark Roche



It is with great sadness that we report the death of **Assistant Chief John O'Donoghue** of the Cambridge Fire Department (Retired). John died on December 28, 2019 at the age of 80. It is appropriate that we post this farewell to John on the "Instructors Corner" page because John has literally trained thousands of firefighters throughout his career and after his retirement on the subject of elevator rescue, safety and fire service operations during high-rise fires.

John's interest in Elevator Safety for firefighters became a lifelong passion for him and very few people knew more about the subject. He served on the Cambridge Fire Department for 39-years, and was an Instructor at the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy for over 35 years. He was a member of the ASME Safety Code for Elevators Emergency Operations Committee, and a member of the Massachusetts Board of Elevator Regulations.

There is too much to say about Chief O'Donoghue in this limited space so the best thing I can say is that John set the standard for all professional fire officers to strive to achieve. He was a friend to us all and we will miss him personally and professionally.
