

FEBRUARY MEETING:

The February meeting of MIFDI will be held on **Wednesday**, **February 25, 2015** hosted by the Wakefield Fire Department courtesy of Chief Michael Sullivan. We will meet in the Wakefield Public Safety Building training room located at One Union St. (Union Street is the short street that connects Centre St and Princess St one block east of Main St, Wakefield Center). MIFDI last met in Wakefield over 10years ago for our June 2004 meeting.

The training will be provided by Regional Fire Program Specialist David Parr of FEMA Region 1. Dave will speak about the AFG & SAFER Grant program which provides funding grants for the fire service. There are some do's & don'ts with regards to applying for a grant for your department. For those who write grants for your department, this will be an important presentation to attend. There were a total of 62 AFG awards nationwide in 2013 with a total federal share of over \$10-million.



Page 5 **EMS Run** Increase In Heroin Overdoses

The number of heroin overdoses and deaths have sharply increased in Massachusetts during recent months after a period of decline during the summer. The wave of opioid addiction is discouraging and overwhelming efforts to reduce the crisis. State Police reported 114 suspected overdose fatalities in December alone.

Authorities believe that one of the reasons for the increase is the return of heroin mixed with potentially deadly additives to produce an explosive high. Heroin tainted with fentanyl is blamed for an increase in fatal overdoses in Massachusetts. The medication naloxone (Narcan) was used to reverse 138 overdoses in Boston alone during this past December. Without Narcan, many of those survivors might have died.

Another frightening change is the speed of death. Many are dying within minutes after using heroin due to the potency of the drug. It could be due to a mixture fentanyl or pure fentanyl that is causing these fatal overdoses (Fentanyl is a pain killer used in end of life care that is up to 100-times stronger than morphine).

Communities and society continue efforts to increase awareness and education for heroin users. We as first-responders are the ones who must face the problem of people overdosing in bathrooms, bedrooms and automobiles throughout our communities.

We must continue training firefighters with the administration of Narcan and equipping EVERY fire company in the Commonwealth with this life-saving medication to reverse the effects this drug attributed to the death of too many young lives.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

Fuel Hording

Drivers in the United States are currently enjoying some of the lowest prices of gasoline in decades. Future changes in the price of a barrel of oil may be of concern to those of us in fire protection because historically, when fuel prices begin to rise, consumers will hoard fuel to avoid higher costs.

Consumers will use any available container to collect and store fuel including; paint cans, glass bottles, and non-approved large plastic barrels. This is a very dangerous practice, not only for the consumer, but for firefighters as well.

Flammable fuels should only be stored in UL approved containers and stored in quantities limited by code.

A Reminder: According to Massachusetts General Laws: Chapter 148, Section 23,

"No volatile inflammable fluid except an amount not exceeding <u>one-</u> <u>quart</u> contained in an approved safety can, and no non-volatile inflammable fluid except an amount not exceeding <u>ten-gallons</u> for domestic use shall be kept, used or stored in any part of any building used for habitation, and no volatile inflammable fluid in quantity exceeding <u>onegallon</u> contained in an approved safety can, and no non-volatile inflammable fluid in quantity exceeding <u>thirty-gallons</u>, shall be kept, used or stored, except in the tank of an automobile, motor boat or stationary engine, within fifty-feet of any building used for habitation, unless a permit has first been obtained from the head of the fire department under such terms and conditions as he may prescribe".

Remain vigilant and stay safe!
