

RECALL OF MEETING #513

The 513th, meeting of MIFDI was held on February 27, 2008 hosted by the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority at the Riverside Yard in Newton.

The training session was provided by Ted Timmons of the MBTA with a presentation on "Safety on the Rails". Also, John Nichols of the MBTA provided an overview of the program provided to recruit firefighters. The presentations wrapped up outdoors with a display of the MBTA Rescue Support vehicle, available 24/7, equipped with jacks and various rescue equipment needed during incidents involving LRV trains.

President Roche conducted a brief business meeting following the training presentations. Congratulations were offered to member Rick McClellan of Wilmington on his recent promotion to Lieutenant. Member John O'Donoghue spoke on some important elevator code updates including the ISOS Ropes, elevator access, and changes to accept the larger 83" EMS stretcher inside elevators. Member Frank Fitzgerald provided a handout of an article on "SOS - Save Ourselves" showing techniques of diving down a ladder head first. Member Steve Persson provided a report on the Mass Fire Training Council meeting.

Members adjourned for lunch at nearby Papa Razzi Restaurant.

"Choking Game" Courtesy of the CDC-MMWR

The "choking game" is defined as self-strangulation or strangulation by another person with hands or noose to achieve a brief euphoric state caused by cerebral hypoxia. Serious neurologic injury or death can result if strangulation is prolonged. In recent years, news media reports have described numerous deaths among youths attributed to the choking game. Because no traditional public health data collects mortality on this practice, CDC used news media reports to estimate the incidence of deaths from the choking game. The results of that analysis, which identified 82 probable choking game deaths among youths aged 6-19 years during 1995-2007. Seventy-one were male, and the average age was 13.3 years. Parents, educators, and health-care providers should become familiar with warning signs that youths are playing the choking game. Death certificates lack the detail necessary to distinguish choking game deaths from other unintentional strangulation deaths.

A case was defined as a death, described in a news report, resulting from self-strangulation or strangulation by another person as part of an activity with elements of the chocking game (also knows as the "blackout game", "pass-out game", "scarf game", "space monkey" among others). Deaths were not included if mention was made of "autoerotic asphyxiation", a practice of choking oneself during sexual stimulation that is usually engaged in by teen-aged or adult males. Deaths also excluded from the report if the medical examiner ruled the death as suicide or of undetermined intent coupled with no mention of the choking game.

Among the 70 deaths for which sufficient detail was reported, 67 occurred while the decedent was alone. Most parents of decedents said they were not aware of the choking game until the death of their child. Choking game deaths occurred in 31 states with no geographic clustering evident.

The following are some warning signs that need to be recognized; mention of the choking game, (or by its other names); bloodshot eyes; marks on the neck; frequent severe headaches; disorientation after time alone; ropes, scarves, or belts tied to bedroom furniture or doorknobs or these items found knotted on the floor.

President's Note: This disturbing trend among young people is surprising and troubling. We as First-Responders may be faced with responding to EMS runs involving these incidents so it is important for us to have an understanding of what may have been the cause.
