



MARCH MEETING:

We will meet in the õLink classroomö located on the first floor between the original MFA building and the DFS building next to the cafeteria. We will be greeted by Marshal Coan and MFA Director Walker with an update on the happenings at the Department of Fire Services and the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy. We will also hope meet the new Deputy Director of the MFA.

The training portion will be a focus on FESHE (Fire & Emergency Services Higher Education) a professional development program for educational opportunities geared towards those in the fire service.

0900 Coffee, **1000** Introduction, **1020** Presentation, **1140** Business meeting, **1200** Lunch.

DIRECTIONS:

FROM RT.128/I 95: Take Rt. 20 West to Rt. 27 in Wayland. Turn right on Rt. 27 and continue until Rt. 27 makes a right towards Maynard, *DO <u>NOT</u> TURN RIGHT*, continue straight for aprox 3-miles and the Academy will be on the right. **FROM RT. 495 North:** Take Rt. 85 (Exit 25) towards Hudson. At the traffic light turn left onto Rt.85. Turn right on Broad St. (First traffic light), and at the second traffic light turn right on Rt.62. Continue straight until Rt. 62 takes a left towards Stow, *DO <u>NOT</u> TURN LEFT*, continue straight for aprox 4-miles and the Academy will be on your left.

FROM RT. 495 South: Take Rt.62 (Exit 26) into Hudson Center. Continue halfway around the rotary and continue on Rt.62 East. Continue straight until Rt.62 turns left towards Stow, *DO <u>NOT</u> TURN LEFT*, continue straight for aprox 4-miles and the Academy will be on your left.

Ample parking is available in the upper-lot on the "D-Side" of the MFA campus.

The 563RD meeting of MIFDI was held on February 27, 2013 hosted by the Wilmington Fire Department courtesy of MIFDI member Chief Edward Bradbury and MIFDI member Deputy Chief Richard McClellan.

The training was provided by Robert Carroll of Drager with a very informative presentation on the hidden hazards of Hydrogen Cyanide (HCN). <u>www.draeger.com</u> Following Bobøs program, Rick McClellen provided a glimpse of the multiple-alarm fire which occurred at the Avalon Oaks apartment complex during the blizzard on February 8. It is with profound regret to announce the passing of one of the last remaining founding members of the Massachusetts Institute of Fire Department Instructors, **Chief James F. Rogers** of the Falmouth Fire Department.

Jim Rogers was appointed a Call Firefighter at age 15 in 1942, appointed permanent firefighter in 1949, promoted Deputy Chief at age 28 in 1955, appointed Chief of Department in 1978. He retired in 1986 after 44-years of service to the Town of Falmouth. Jim passed February 27, 2013 at age 85.

Chief Rogers was one of the founding members of MIFDI and served as President from 1961-1962. His son Glen is also a member of MIFDI and served as our representative on the Massachusetts Fire Training Council until his appointment as Chief of Department in Manchester-By-The Sea in 2012.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER: Replace Aging CO Alarms "Beat the Beep"

The Massachusetts Department of Fire Services has a life-safety campaign called õBEAT THE BEEPö which is an educational reminder focused on replacing aging carbon monoxide alarms every 7-years.

Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarms have been required in nearly every residence since March 2006. The life expectancy of carbon monoxide alarms is 5-7 years depending on the alarm manufacturer. Many CO alarms installed after the state & CO Law was passed are now reaching the end of their useful life and need to be replaced. No home appliance lasts forever.

The life of a CO alarm begins when it is first powered up. Most CO alarms have a date of manufacture stamped on them which can be used as a guide if the activation date was not recorded.

One sign that a carbon monoxide alarm should be replaced is a chirping sound that does not stop until the unit is powered off. Another sign that a CO alarm should be replaced is that it makes a low battery signal even after new batteries are installed. Models with a digital readout will show an ERR or EO9 or END message.

The purpose of the õBeat the Beepö campaign is to alert residents that their CO alarms may be reaching the end of their lifecycles and should be replaced BEFORE the beeps indicating end of life. This also provides continuous protection against possible CO poisoning and reduces the number of false alarms to local fire departments.

Since Nicholeøs Law took effect in 2006 requiring CO alarms in every Massachusetts residence, many people have been saved from CO poisoning. CO alarms notified them that something was wrong at the earliest possible stages of CO detection. There have still been deaths from CO poisoning, but in most cases those homes had no CO alarm.
