

MARCH MEETING:

The March meeting of MIFDI will be held on <u>Wednesday, March 22, 2017</u> which is our annual visit to the Massachusetts Department of Fire Services and the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy courtesy of State Fire Marshal Peter Ostroskey. We will meet in the Boards & Commissions Conference Room, (Check the welcome screen in the lobby in the event of a room location change).

Our presentation will be offered by David DiGregorio, Acting Director of the DFS Haz-Mat Division. Dave will provide an overview and update on the Statewide Haz-Mat Operations which offers support, technical advice and mitigation of hazardous material incidents throughout the Commonwealth. We expect to also have State Fire Marshal Peter Ostroskey stop in and offer greetings on behalf of the Department of Fire Services.

SCHEDULE:

0900: Coffee (Available in the cafeteria), **1000:** Presentation, **1130:** Business meeting, **1200:** Lunch (On our own in the facility cafeteria on site).

DIRECTIONS:

FROM RT.128/I 95: Take Rt. 20 West to Rt. 27 in Wayland. Turn right on Rt. 27 and continue until Rt. 27 makes a right towards Maynard, *DO NOT TURN RIGHT*, continue straight for aprox 3-miles and the Academy will be on the right.

FROM RT. 495 North: Take Rt. 85 (Exit 25) towards Hudson. At the traffic light turn left onto Rt.85. Turn right on Broad St. (First traffic light), and at the second traffic light turn right on Rt.62. Continue straight until Rt. 62 takes a left towards Stow, *DO NOT TURN LEFT*, continue straight for aprox 4-miles and the Academy will be on your left. FROM RT. 495 South: Take Rt.62 (Exit 26) into Hudson Center. Continue halfway around the rotary and continue on Rt.62 East. Continue straight until Rt.62 turns left towards Stow, *DO NOT TURN LEFT*, continue straight on Rt.62 turns left towards Stow, *DO NOT TURN LEFT*, continue straight for aprox 4-miles and the Academy will be on your left.

Ample parking is available in the upper-lot on the "D-Side" of the MFA campus.



RECALL OF MEETING #2017-02

The February meeting of MIFDI was held on February 22, 2017 hosted the by the Shrewsbury Fire Department courtesy of MIFDI member and Chief of Department James Vuona

Our training was presented by Mr. Larry Dinofio of National Grid with a very informative program on Gas & C.O. Emergencies for the Fire Service. Larry began with a dramatic video showing the effects of a major gas leak in a residential neighborhood causing an explosion in four dwellings. The presentation continued with a look at the gas distribution system, the basic properties of gas including the explosive range of 5%-15%, the valves that we should and should not shut off, and shared some extraordinary experiences witnessed by him during his career in the gas company. The presentation concluded with an overview of carbon monoxide and the importance of using your multi-gas meters whenever C.O. is suspected in a structure.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

Knox SecureCap Captain Mark Roche - MIFDI President

The manufacture of the Knox Box has recently developed a new item called "SecureCap". The Knox SecureCap is designed to be placed on the Fire Department Connection (FDC) of a sprinkler/standpipe feed. The SecureCap is available for both the 2.5" connections and the 4" or 5" Stortz connection. The SecureCap is also available with a female end to secure the standpipe discharge connection inside the building.

The purpose of these devices is to; (1) Prevent theft of the brass fittings, (2) Prevent trash from being stuffed inside the FDC, (3) Prevent rodents from building nests inside the FDC, (4) Reduce the risk of damage to the connection threads, (5) Prevent vandals turning on the standpipe discharge valve inside a stairwell causing water damage to the building.

An orange colored Knox Keywrench should be provided to every fire company (Recommend having TWO, one for the MPO and one with the high-rise hose). Buildings equipped with these devices should also be required to place a keywrench in the Master Box. Unlike the Knox Box key, the keywrench for the SecureCap is <u>universal</u> so when responding on mutual aid you have the ability to use the key in any community.

REMOVAL: (1) Inspect the lock head and remove any debris including snow or ice. (2) Rotate the head to a detent position until a click is heard. (3) While holding the cap with a spanner, use the keywrench to turn the lock counter clockwise until it stops, aprox 2-3 turns. (4) Use a spanner to unscrew the cap counter clockwise from the connection. **NOTE**: Always use caution when removing caps that may have water pressure behind them. **ALSO**: The handle of the keywrench is equipped with two small holes that fit the two protrusions on the FDC SecureCap to allow removal of the cap counter clockwise while holding the swivel with a spanner.

A final note; there are many opinions and concerns regarding these SecureCaps that I will not get into for this article. The most important thing here is to be sure that every company is equipped with at least one keywrench that is accessible to everyone on the crew. As always, if you are unable to unlock the locks from the FDC or if the FDC is blocked, damaged, or inaccessible, you can always feed the system from the interior standpipe connection. If the interior discharge connection is equipped with a SecureCap and you do not have a key, you are out of business. It is important to check the buildings in your district for these during inspections and pre-plans and to add the information in your dispatch CAD system.
