

#### **APRIL MEETING:**.

The April meeting of MIFDI will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 27</u>, <u>2016</u> hosted by the Brookline Fire Department courtesy of Chief Paul Ford and Deputy Chief James Corbett of the Brookline Fire Department Training Division. We will meet in the Training Division classroom in the basement level of Fire Station 6, 962 Hammond St. We last met in Brookline in June 2011.

Our training will be provided by Dave Gallagher with an interesting presentation on FireIce Solutions followed by a live fire demonstration in the drill yard. FireIce is a new generation fire suppression agent that acts as a force multiplier by enhancing the capability of water. When mixed with water, FireIce helps break the fire triangle by creating a dense oxygen barrier and supercharges the cooling effect.

**0930:** Coffee, **1000:** Presentation, **1130:** Business Meeting, **1200:** Lunch (off site)

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

From Rt.128, take Exit 20A (Rt.9 EAST). Follow Rt.9 aprox 6-traffic lights (3.4 miles). Turn right at the 6<sup>th</sup> light onto Hammond St. (former gas station on corner). Follow Hammond St. .08 miles and the firehouse will be on the left. Turn into the driveway on the D-Side of the station to the rear drill yard where there is plenty of parking.





#### **INSTRUCTORS CORNER:**

#### Fire Prevention & Education Award Winner

The National Volunteer Fire Council (NVFC) has announced the recipient of the 2016 Fire Prevention & Education Award is Lieutenant Michael McLeieer. The presentation will be awarded at the NVFC banquet on May 6, 2016 in Alexandria VA. Michael McLeieer was selected through a nationwide nomination process for his exemplary dedication to fire prevention in his community and beyond.

This award annually honors an individual who has made a major contribution in the field of fire prevention. As part of the award, Michael will receive a trip to Alexandria to attend the ceremony, a complimentary one-year membership to NVFC, and a personalized award.

Michael has demonstrated an outstanding commitment to public education in his community and nationally. More than two decades ago, he founded the nonprofit organization E.S.C.A.P.E. (Education Showing Children and Adults Procedures for Evacuations) whose mission is to reach children and adults about fire prevention, CPR, and first aid. Students who participated in his fire safety education program achieved a 98% success rate when tested on how to respond correctly to a fire. The importance of this course was demonstrated when a 4-year old led his parents from their smoke-filled home the night after the child participated in the course.

Michael has also played a role in education on a state and national level. For seven years, he served as the Training & Scheduling Coordinator at the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy for the statewide Youth Fire Intervention Program. Michael has presented at the National Fire Academy, Vision 20/20 Models in Fire Prevention Symposium, the FDIC (Fire Department Instructors Conference), and the NFPA International conference.

Michael McLeieer joined the Merrimac MA Fire Department in 2000, and the Olivet MI Fire Department in 2013. "He exemplifies the philosophy of fire prevention, educating over one-million people in the last two decades"
