





# Page 5 <u>MS Run</u> EMT Killed In New York

An FDNY EMS Division member was run over and killed by her own ambulance on March 16, 2017 by a man who car-jacked the ambulance after he was caught joyriding on the rear-step. EMT Yadira Arroyo, age 44 and mother of five, was crushed under the wheels of the FDNY ambulance and her partner was seriously injured.

The incident began when a passing motorist alerted members that a man was riding on the rear step of their ambulance. When the ambulance pulled over for EMS members to confront the rider, the man overpowered the crew and jumped into the driver's seat. As the perp drove off, Arroyo clung on the side of the vehicle dragging her until she apparently fell off and was rolled over by the ambulance. EMT Arroyo was transported to the hospital and pronounced dead. The second EMS member was also transported and listed in serious condition. The 25-year-old male with a criminal history was apprehended after the ambulance struck a parked vehicle and will be facing murder charges for this incident.



PRESIDENTS NOTE: This was a tragic and senseless incident that should have never happened. I know that departments do not usually keep the doors locked on their ambulances for many reasons, especially the box and cabinet doors. You may consider making a habit of this, in particular when transporting to a trauma center in an unfamiliar urban area. Does your "bus" have a fold down rear step? If so it should be kept upright when not in use so it does not attract an unwanted rider. Maybe a pull-out rear step should be considered by ambulance manufacturers? A back-up camera should be part of every ambulance. When backing into a busy ED, the "tech" does not leave the patient to assist the driver backing up. The camera also allows you to pull over and briefly put the transmission in reverse to activate the camera if you suspect something is going on behind the rig. Finally, unlike a fire company with 3-4 members, there are only two people on the ambulance that can be easily overpowered by a deranged individual. We do not carry weapons, nor do we want to. You should however keep a 1.62oz canister of Pepper Mace in the front console of our ambulance for protection of our crew. Our local police agencies would gladly supply the mace and the proper training in its use. Remain vigilant and be safe!

We regretfully cancelled our March meeting to allow the staff of the DFS & MFA as well as MIFDI members to attend the funeral service of Watertown Firefighter Joseph Toscano.

We hope to reschedule this meeting in the near future.

I am disheartened to see that we lost THREE active firefighters during the month of March. The major killer of firefighters continues to be cancer and heart attack. Although the number of fires has decreased over the past decade, the death rate of firefighters continues to grow. The fire service must continue to work closely with health care providers and university studies to reduce these discouraging statistics (See Instructors Corner article on protective hoods).

## **INSTRUCTORS CORNER:**



Firefighter PPE is exposed to a wide range of toxic chemicals, biological pathogens, and other hazardous substances. These contaminant exposures can pose significant immediate and long-term dangers to firefighters' health with an increased risk of cancer topping the list. General care & maintenance procedures have been established in NFPA 1851: Standard on Selection, Care and Maintenance of Protective Ensembles for Structural Fire Fighting & Proximity Fire Fighting.

Firefighter protective hoods, a primary piece of firefighter's Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), provide a safety interface between the helmet, SCBA face-piece, and turnout coat and are particularly concerning due to direct exposure to a firefighter's skin.

As we await additional scientific research on PPE, it is important that the fire service be aware of the following to reduce potential contaminant exposure:

Protective hoods are in direct contact with the skin.

The face and neck have been identified as a significant area of dermal exposure to products of combustion and potential carcinogens. Firefighter protective hoods are potential carriers of harmful products.

As part of an overall occupational health and safety program, organizations should educate personnel about the proper use and care of protective clothing and establish the following practices in accordance with NFPA 1851:

Wash protective hoods after every fire or emergency service use. Inspect for damage and continued serviceability after every fire or emergency service use.

Do NOT allow protective hoods to be taken home, to a Laundromat, or to a dry cleaner for washing.
