



RECALL OF MEETING #584

Meeting 2015-4 of MIFDI was held on April 22, 2015 hosted by the Chelmsford Fire Department courtesy of MIFDI member Chief Michael Curran. The training was provided by Mr. Bill Kinch, a paramedic and life care provider for over 30-years. Bill spoke about the effects of some of the products of combustion including carbon monoxide and hydrogen cyanide and the importance of wearing SCBA during firefighting AND the overhaul stage. He also spoke about firefighter rehab, especially during the summer months.



Following the presentation, President Roche conducted a brief business meeting. A moment of silence was offered for retired Sharon Deputy Chief Steve Cummings who passed away unexpectedly on April 17, 2015 at age 58. Captain Connerty provided some highlights from the MFTC. John O'Donoghue spoke on an effort spearheaded by Boston DFC Shea about training firefighters on the use of construction elevators for firefighting operations during fires on upper floors of high rise buildings under construction.

At the conclusion of the business meeting, Chief Curran spoke about the project history and challenges overcome for the construction of their impressive new headquarters station. Members were then given a tour by Chief Curran and Deputy Chief Donoghue.

Members adjourned for lunch at the nearby "110 Grill".

EMS Run

As the demand for Narcan increases, so does the price

The Attorney General in Massachusetts is investigating the skyrocketed cost of naloxone and demanding that companies selling the product explain why the price has nearly doubled since a public health emergency was declared by former Governor Patrick last year.

Public Safety agencies in the Commonwealth have seen a dramatic increase in this life-saving medication used to reverse the effects of drug overdoses. EMS budgets are being strained, not only by the increased price of the drug, but also due to the large number of overdoses of heroin and other opiates in the past few years. The opiod overdose crisis is responsible for the deaths of hundreds of people each year from all areas and all income groups throughout the Commonwealth.

The Office of the District Attorney in Norfolk County is helping communities with the cost by providing up to \$1000 per community to purchase narcan using assets seized from drug arrests. As Norfolk D.A. Michael Morrissey stated, "what better way to spend forfeiture money then to keep people alive". We could not agree more.

"Notify whoever the power company is" Captain Mark Roche

During a recent incident involving a tree branch grounding against a primary power line, the request was made for dispatch to "Have NSTAR respond". After a period of standing by with the engine company, the welcome sight of a white bucket-truck approaches and pulled up in front of us. I pick up the radio to notify dispatch of their arrival on scene, "Fire Alarm, NSTAR uh, correction, Eversource is on scene".

As of February 2, 2015, Northeast Utilities, the parent company of NSTAR, Western Mass Electric, Yankee Gas Services Co, Public Service Co of New Hampshire, and Connecticut Light & Power Co all took on the new name of "Eversource Energy" servicing 3.6 million customers in New England.

Emergency contact numbers will remain the same, and of course, so will the bill payments. But for those of us in the fire service continuing the long practice of calling for "Edison", there may come a time when our future generations will not know who Thomas Edison is. So for now, notify "Eversource".
