

INSTRUCTORS CORNER: Solar Powered Trash Container

(Captain Mark Roche – Newton Fire Department)

The "Bigbelly" solar power high capacity trash compactor has recently become very popular in communities across America and throughout the world. My city received 340 of these units which have been placed in parks, business districts, bus stops and other highly populated areas.

These units are fully contained with a trash door on the front similar to a mailbox. The trash is placed inside the door which drops the trash into a plastic bin below. When the trash reaches a certain level, a compactor powered by solar, compacts the trash to allow 150 gallons of trash to compact to 33-gallons.

So as firefighters what should we know about these containers? The most obvious is the trash fire caused by a discarded cigarette or a juvenile prank. You can simple aim the hose-line into the trash door and flood the bin. Once the fire is contained, the access door below can be opened (Firefighters should be provided with keys to avoid damaging these costly units). Using a tool, the remains of the trash and melted bin can be removed for a final overhaul. **NEVER** reach inside to remove the bin. Although the compactor moves slow and only compacts half-way and does have safety interlocks, there is potential for injury.

The power for the unit is located on the upper portion of the container. It is equipped with a 20-volt polycrystalline silicon solar cell PV module located on the top of the unit protected by a polycarbonate bubble. There is an access door on top (using a different key) to expose the wiring and components including a low-voltage sealed battery similar to the battery used as a power back-up in a fire alarm control panel (FACP). If a fire should occur in the upper portion of the unit, use a Co2 extinguisher to control the fire. Although this is low-voltage power, always use caution in the power cell area.

If the container is struck by a vehicle and causes damage to the components, simply disconnect the battery and tape off the unit until your local public works is notified.

The unit does have an optional cover to prevent usage during high-profile public events or a visiting dignitary nearby to avoid placement of an I.E.D. inside. This is always a concern in our new world.
