



RECALL OF MEETING #2017-04

The April meeting of MIFDI was held on April 26, 2017 hosted the by the Arlington Fire Department courtesy of Chief Robert Jefferson and MIFDI member Captain Dan Kerr.


Our training was presented by Acting Chief Gerard Mahoney of the Cambridge Fire Department with a look at the challenges faced by Cambridge firefighters on December 3, 2016 during a 10-alarm fire in East Cambridge. Chief Mahoney spoke about the importance of staging, accountability, communications, water supply, and logistics during such a large scale operation. He also touched on some of the aftermath responsibilities such as sheltering the now homeless residents, protecting personal property in the burnt out buildings, shutting utilities in each of the damaged structures, clean-up of hazardous products such as asbestos, fuel oil tanks, gasoline from vehicles, etc.

Following the presentation, a brief business meeting was conducted by President Roche beginning with a moment of silence for Watertown Firefighter Joseph Toscano who died LODD on March 17, 2017. John Spillane spoke on the new MFA Impac Programs being offered. Andy Connerty talked briefly on the Mass Fire Training Council. Jason Fricker spoke about a recent fire in Rockland in a large vacent building and mentioned how pre-planning and a blitz-attack operation worked to save the severly exposed houses in the neighborhood. Members adjourned for a tour of Arlington's historic 1924 octagonal fire station which was beautifully restored in 2015. The unofficial meeting reconviened for lunch at Jimmy's Steer House Restaurant in Arlington.

Director - Massachusetts Firefighting Academy

The Department of Fire Services seeks a Director who is a seasoned manager in an environment of similar complexity who can provide effective leadership, communication, and management to a specialized training organization steeped in tradition. The Department of Fire Services is an Equal Opportunity / Affirmative Action Employer.

NOTE: This is a Group 1 position for purposes of retirement classification under M.G.L. Chapter 3, however, due to pension reform, any active member as of April 2, 2012 <u>may</u> elect to receive a retirement allowance based upon a pro-ration of the years of service in more than one group classification.

This provision under Chapter 32, Section 5 is important as it may minimize the impact for interested applicants, who would be transferring from a Group 4 position to this Group 1 position, as they will retain retirement credit for their years of Group 4 service.

Please note that Chapter 32, Section 3 requires candidates moving to a Group 4 position in the future to work a minimum of 12-months in Group 4 prior to being eligible for retirement under that Group.
