Positron is a Canada based corporation specializing in CAD, (computer aided dispatch), software for the public safety sector. It was pointed out that a computerized 'call taking and records management system' differs greatly from a CAD system, but the two work hand in hand to improve dispatch operations.

Teaching Tip

Helping Students Feel Free to Ask Questions

Many students would rather go outside to pick up their morning newspaper in their underwear than ask a question in front of a dozen or more students. It is essential for an instructor to communicate to students that their questions are welcome. Here are several suggestions helpful for encouraging students to ask questions:

- Tell student their questions are always appropriate. Remind them frequently that you encourage being asked about the material.
- Respond to any and all questions as thoroughly as possible. This communicates that you appreciate the student's inquiry.
- Request the name of the student who asked the question (if you don't know it), to show that you value his or her participation in the class. If you know the student's name, use it in your answer.
- To help shy students ask questions, use the "one-minute paper" technique. During the last few moments of class, have students take out a sheet of paper and jot down one of the main points from the presentation along with one question they still have about the topic. The students should hand these papers in as they leave. The instructor reads them, chooses a few of the most appropriate or common questions, and begins the next class by answering them. This encourages more questions to come up during class. It also tells the instructor how well students have been following the presentation.
