

RECALL OF MEETING #516

Report of the 516th MIFDI Meeting at Merrimac Fire/Rescue Headquarters on Wednesday, May 28, 2008. Meeting called to order at 1010 hrs. by Director Frank Fitzgerald. Attendance was 23 including one guest and Merrimac fire dog "Jake." President Roche was at the Pierce Fire Apparatus plant and VP Brian Belliveau was not available. The presenter was Treas. Mike McLeieer and so Chief Fitzgerald was asked to conduct the meeting and take notes. Our host, Chief Ralph Spencer, MFD was introduced and greeted the members.

Following the usual business portion, Treas. McLeieer was introduced. Mike gave a presentation on the 2008 FDIC Training Conference at Indianapolis, (web site - www.fdic.com). Mike covered several fire safety subjects with power point illustrations and fire scenes, including: CAMPUS FIRE SAFETY - there were 6 fire deaths in MA. DRIVE TO SURVIVE - Require CDL. Fire Tanker rollovers while responding. THE ART OF READING SMOKE - how the fire is moving and when to be careful. Video shown of Danvers MA CAI fire disaster last year. Mike also distributed two CD's of the Conference to the members.

At 1140 Director Bob McKendrick, a member of the Chemical Fire Safety Board, discussed the Board's responsibility.

At 1147 Paul Antonellis of Anna Maria College discussed restaurant fire problems and safety.

At 1155 Capt. Steve Persson gave his monthly report from the MA Fire Academy nothing new.

Treas. Mike announced new rates for our Treasury investments and that we have 119 active members.

The June monthly meeting will be in Framingham at the "Bunker" off Route 9 on the 18th. Meeting adjourned at 1230 to lunch.

FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT:

In May we were once again hosted by the Merrimac Fire Department as our Treasurer, Webmaster and Past President Michael McLeieer presented us with some of the highlights of the 2008 Fire Department Instructors Conference. I was unable to attend this meeting due to another trip to Appleton for the final inspection of a new pumper for my department. I thank Michael for his presentation to our members as well as Chief Ralph Spencer for hosting MIFDI. I also want to thank Director Frank Fitzgerald for picking up the gavel in my absence.

On May 10, 2008, I was honored to attend the dedication of the Brockton Firefighters Strand Theatre Memorial in memory of the 13 Brockton firefighters that died in the line of duty on March 10, 1941 after the roof suddenly collapsed during firefighting operations. Let us never forget the sacrifice made by these brave men and always be mindful of the hidden hazards above and below us during interior firefighting operations. Throughout the years, the fire service has learned some harsh lessons from past tragedies. One of the more difficult but most important decisions facing the fireground commander today is when to write off the structure and get the troops out by switching operations to a defensive mode. Even then the fireground is not without risk until a sufficient collapse zone is established.

One again, MIFDI member David Jardin will participate in the 2008 Pan-Mass Challenge on August 2 & 3. The PMC is a 192-mile bike-athon to support the Jimmy Fund cancer research and treatment at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. Our June meeting will provide MIFDI members with a fascinating tour and explanation of the operations at the MEMA Bunker in Framingham. This is a rare opportunity for members to get a first-hand look at this facility.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER

2008 Fire/EMS Safety, Health & Survival Week June 22-28, 2008

Committed to long-term results encourages long-term investments by chiefs and firefighters to enhance their health and safety. The ultimate goal is to institute a strong culture of health and safety within the Fire/EMS service.

This year's theme reflects the need for organizational action that supports and encourages a safety culture. Recommended activities and materials will incorporate three key areas where standard operating procedures, policies and initiatives, along with the training and enforcement that supports them, can limit fire/EMS personnel's risk of injury or death:

Fully implement NFPA 1500, especially sections addressing PPE: Provide compliant PPE, Train and enforce use of PPE including SCBA.

Fully implement the Wellness-Fitness Initiative: *Provide annual medical and physical evaluations, Provide equipment and time for exercise, Provide nutrition information.*

Initiate an emergency vehicle policy: Always buckle up, Always stop at red lights and stop signs, Always drive at speed limits and defensively.

Focusing on these 2008 key safety areas from Sunday to Saturday provides maximum flexibility, allowing for all duty shifts (both career and volunteer) to participate in your department's selected exercises at some point during Safety Week.
