



RECALL OF MEETING #576

MIFDI Meeting - Merrimac Fire Department-May 28, 2014

President Mark Roche quickly snapped the gavel to open the meeting at 10:15. There were twenty-four (24) members were in attendance. President Roche recognize Chief Ralph Spencer and the Merrimac Fire Department. Chief Spencer spoke about an incident in Haverhill and about the water issues that Haverhill was experiencing. Merrimac responded directly to the fire and laid 1600 feet of four-inch hose. They fed two engines and two ladder trucks, plus they had to battle some brushfire. Merrimac was tied up for10 hours in Haverhill, luckily there was no loss of any life; however, there was one injury.

Treasurer Michael McLeieer gave a great presentation on the 2014 FDIC: Where Leaders Comes To Train. He offered a roster for members to sign to receive two hours of fire prevention credentialing. He stated that he had thirty-eight (38) CDs, containing one-hundred and five presentations that would be handed out after his presentation. Michael, as always, highlighted some of the more interesting presentations from FDIC such as the *First Five Minutes, 10 Signs of Trouble, High-Tech Highways, NIMS and ICS, and Principles of Extrication*. Michael stated that there were over 32,000 attendees this year and next year's FDIC will be the third week of April. He also went over the new changes in Hazardous Materials.

After Michael's presentation President Roche once again thanked Merrimac Fire Department. He also introduced Board of Directors and Officers of MIDFI. President Roche mentioned a retirement party for Vice-President Brian Belleview, will be held on May 31, at his home at 81 Ross Street, Fitchburg, MA.

President Roche then introduced newly promoted Chief Rick McClellan, from Wilmington Fire Department, who praised now retired Chief Ed Bradley for his years of service. President Roche on behalf of MIFDI presented to Chief Bradley a certificate of appreciation.

MIFDI Representative to the Mass Fire Training Council (MFTC) Andy Connerty gave his report from MFTC. He informed the members to look at their contracts, and the language therein, regarding the passing of recruit training: there have been a few issues regarding this item. He further informed MIFDI members to have any recruit with a learning disability should inform the Fire Academy early on, so they can make accommodations. Representative Connerty informed the members that there has been talk about the Fire Prevention credentialing process and that changes were coming. The members were also informed that the new MFA director, Shawn Murray, has resigned.

President Roche reminded all members that former MFA director, Edmund Walker, is now the Chief of the Peterborough Fire Department in New Hampshire.

There was some information relayed by Belmont members regarding a three alarm fire, in a three-decker on Marlboro Street, in Belmont. A great effort, made by all, ensured the saving of the exposures.

Past-President Bob MacKendrick informed members that everything is going well with NFPA-1, even though there was some kickback from one of the Builders Association.

There was motion to reimburse Treasurer Michael McLeieer for expenses over and above the cap of \$800 to the amount of \$35.64. There was a second and the motion carried. Treasurer Michael McLeieer finished with a presentation regarding the changes in the Hazardous Material, labeling and placarding as well as the new Safety Data Sheets.

Deputy Fire Chief John O'Donahue (Ret.) informed the membership that an elevator rescue class will be held at Mass Port on June 18th though the Massachusetts Fire Academy. John will be the presenter.

There was a motion to adjourn, that was seconded and the motion passed. The meeting continued informally at Sylvan Street Grille in Salisbury. Next month's meeting will be announced later.

Page 5 <u>EMS Run</u> CVA (Stroke)

Blood vessels that carry blood to the brain from the heart are called arteries. The brain needs a constant supply of blood, which carries the oxygen and nutrients it needs to function. Each artery supplies blood to specific areas of the brain. A stroke occurs when one of these arteries to the brain either is blocked or bursts. As a result, part of the brain does not get the blood it needs, so it starts to die.

Common stroke symptoms:

Sudden numbress or weakness of face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body.

Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.


Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.

Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination. Sudden severe headache with no known cause.

Other important but less common symptoms include:

- Sudden nausea and vomiting (different from a viral illness due to a sudden onset vs. hours or days)
- Brief loss of consciousness or a period of decreased consciousness (fainting, confusion, convulsions, coma)

Transportation to a medical facility with a "Cath-Lab" and treatment with "clot-buster" drug (IPA) can significantly reduce the damage caused by a stroke. Treatment is more effective if given quickly, every minute counts!
