



RECALL OF MEETING 2015-05

President Roche opened the meeting at 10:10 at the Merrimac Fire Department and welcomed everyone and introduce Treasurer Michael McLeieer who - on behalf of the Merrimac Fire Department – sent along Chief Ralph Spencer's regards who was at the Mass Fire Academy. Treasurer McLeieer gave an informative presentation on experiences at the 2105 FDIC. He explained the CD and all of its contents; over 100 presentations, as well as more in depth the seven that he attended. Such as *Developing* a Training Program for Today's Fire Service, in which consistency, a training calendar, preparation, and lesson plans that anyone can follow are key. Conducting and Apparatus Needs Analysis, was another one which was a comprehensive class on not just shooting from the hip regarding equipment selection. The third presentation was How Diversity and Politics Influence Change Management, in this presentation, member Chief Paul Antonellis, Jr. (ret.) spoke on this topic. "Spec-ing" out fire trucks was another presentation. Treasurer McLeieer reminded all that June 19th is deadline for April 18-23, 2016 FDIC topics. The fourth presentation was This Ain't Your Mamma's Large Vehicle Fire, highlighted the problems such as plastics, rescues, and RIT. These vehicles have become more popular (i.e. box trucks, 18 wheelers, converted school buses, military vehicles, large agricultural trailers, etc.) These are not an ABC extinguisher fire, it is more like a house fire with 8 times the heat release, LP cylinders (not visible), and no way of telling what is inside these vehicles. The fifth and final presentation was Required Training: A Guide for the Training Officer. which explained how to engage the audience and about active learning. Treasurer McLeieer also spoke about the new USFA-NFA Managing Officer Program http:// www.usfa.fema.gov/training/nfa/programs/mo program.html which is a two-year program for Company Officers and is modeled after the successful Executive Fire Officer Program.

President Roche introduced Jane McCluskey, of Jones & Bartlett Learning, who spoke about the company, located in Sudbury and now in Burlington, and having been in business since the 1970s with the release of their first fire service related book in 2002, the Fundamentals of Firefighting. Ms. McCluskey noted that if anyone wanted a free desk copies she would willing to meet to discuss that. She also went over the *Evidence-Based Practices for Strategic and Tactical Firefighting*, a NIST supplement that she distributed to attendees for free. Check out their website for more information on their publications, and contact her for any questions and any discounts she could offer.

BullEx's Mike Hennick and Samantha Salisbury (Albany, NY a division of Lion apparel) reviewed some training products such as new products for fire prevention, as well as a prop for operations with a hand-line (or laser mode with zero visibility and no residue). They mentioned that the fast-food chain Firehouse Subs can help with grants.

A Moment of Silence was observed for Fire Chief Borden, of Haverhill, MA, and his sudden passing.

(May Meeting Minutes Continued)

The Treasurer's report was approved, as was the reimbursement for the FDIC hotel (\$472.48)
Treasurer McLeieer as stated that he would be meeting with the web-developer to launch a new website for September meeting.
There were currently 124 members of MIFDI and, again, thanked everyone for coming. This was the last meeting as Chief for Mike Curran, and on Saturday, June 27th, in Chelmsford, MA, there would be a retirement in his honor.

Captain Andrew Connerty from MFTC gave his report and recruit classes are moving along well and a


learning disability protocol was updated, where recruits must identify early on, and have an IEP no older than 5 years or doctor saying you have a Learning Disability. Failing a final exam will not allow a recruit to graduate, but can take the exam one more time. Also, the Fire Officer III class pre-requisite for exam no longer need FI-2 (effective September 2015). There is a Fire Officer IV exam, as well as a Chief Fire Officer Training Program, although not certified.

John O'Donoghue had a meeting with the Academy Director about elevators and the rebuilding of a prop, which will go forward.

Bob McKendrick spoke on Fire Prevention, noting that nothing was added to the meeting and the MA amendment to NFPA should be adopted in the next code cycle. There is, however, a problem with board. There are some chiefs that have retired and have not been replaced. Finally, there is an Executive Order to look at old things (pompier ladder, life net, riding a horse on wooden bridge, etc.) to be taken out of the laws and regulations. Nominate the same slate of Officers and Board of Directors... motion passed...

The meeting was adjourned at noon and the unofficial meeting was continued at Markey's Lobster Pound in Seabrook, NH. The next meeting is on June 24th in Fitchburg and the topic will be on Positive Pressure Vehicle mounted on PU truck. And annual cookout at B & B (Fitchburg) www.howarthhouse.com.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

Summary of **Massachusetts Fireworks Law** MGL Chapter 148, S. 39

What does the law prohibit?

It is illegal for private citizens to use, possess, or sell fireworks in Massachusetts, or to purchase them legally elsewhere and then transport them into the state. The law prohibits any article designed to produce a visible or audible effect.

Sale of fireworks

Penalty: Fine or imprisonment or both, and confiscation

Fine: \$100 to \$1000

Imprisonment: Maximum of 1 year **Seizure of fireworks:** Mandatory

Who can arrest? Any officer qualified to serve criminal process.

Must an officer arrest? No. Statute says the officer may arrest without a warrant.

Must an officer seize the fireworks? Yes, the statute says the officer shall seize any fireworks.

Possession, use, cause to explode of fireworks

Penalty: Fine and confiscation only

Fine: \$10 to \$100

Seizure of fireworks: Mandatory

Who can seize? Any officer qualified to serve criminal process.

May an officer arrest? For possession, no. The statute only provides for a fine upon conviction and automatic confiscation of fireworks.

Must an officer seize the fireworks? Yes, the statute says the officer shall seize any fireworks.

Seizure

Can people get their fireworks back? No. If convicted, the fireworks are forfeited to the state.

What does an officer do with confiscated fireworks? During business hours, contact the State Police Bomb Squad at (978) 567-3310. Notify them immediately for large quantities, commercial grade, or deteriorated materials. After hours, call (508) 820-2121 and ask for the Troop Duty Officer in your area. An on-call Bomb Squad Officer will arrange for pick-up.
