



RECALL OF MEETING #2017-04

The May meeting of MIFDI was held on May 24, 2017 hosted the by the Merrimac Fire Department courtesy of Chief Ralph Spencer.

Our training was presented by MIFDI member Michael McLeieer with a recap of the 2017 FDIC Training Conference held annually in Indianapolis. As always, Michael did a superb job sharing some of the highlights of the FDIC. One of the more powerful presentations this year was a focus on occupational cancer in the fire service. Those in attendance received a CD which included many of the presentations.



Following the presentation, a brief business meeting was conducted by President Roche. Andy Connerty talked briefly on the Mass Fire Training Council. John O'Donoghue provided an update on the elevator code and fire service operations. President Roche made mention of the ballistic vests recently issued to Chelsea firefighters were quickly put to use during a domestic incident in that city when a barricaded shooter set his home on fire.

The unofficial meeting reconvened for lunch at Markey's Seafood Restaurant in nearby Seabrook.

Page 5 <u>EMS Run</u> *Carfentanil*

Carfentanil has apparently made its way into New England and is EXTREMELY potent. The powder of this substance found at an EMS call for an overdose or unresponsive person can provide a significant safety risk for first-responders. The drug in a powder form can be inhaled or absorbed so be sure to use extreme caution with scene safety.

Carfentanil is a synthetic opioid approximately 10,000 times more potent than morphene and 100 times more potent than fentanyl. The presence of carfentanil in illicit drug markets is a serious concern as the strength of this drug could lead to an increase in overdoses, even among opioid-tolerant users.

Carfentanil is used as a tranquilizing agent for elephants and other large animals and can be lethal for humans at the 2-milligram range.

Carfentanil can quickly reach toxic levels in the human body. Exposure to this drug causes symptoms similar to those of opiod toxicity and overdose including; pinpoint pupils, shallow breathing, dizziness, lethargy, loss of consciousness, nausea/vomiting, weak pulse, cold/ clammy skin, and heart failure.

NARCAN WILL REVERSE A CARFENTANIL OVERDOSE BUT REQUIRES MULTIPLE DOSES.

Review your protocols for administering Naloxone (Narcan) and contact your local Medical Director regarding administering multiple doses of Narcan to reverse the effects of this potent drug that is killing our young people throughout the country.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

2017 Hurricane Season

June 1 marks the beginning of the 2017 Atlantic hurricane season which ends on November 30. The National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Prediction Center reports the Atlantic could see another above normal hurricane season this year.

Forecasters predict a 70% likelihood of 11-17 named storms (winds of 39 mph of higher), of which 5-9 could become hurricanes (winds 74 mph or higher), and 2-4 major hurricanes (Category 3, 4, or 5; winds of 111 mph or higher).

The average hurricane season produces 12 named storms of which 6 become hurricanes, including 3 major hurricanes.
