## **INSTRUCTORS CORNER:** 2018 Hurricane Season

June 1 marks the beginning of the 2018 Atlantic hurricane season which ends on November 30. The National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Prediction Center reports the hurricane season will be near or above normal this year.

Due to the devastating season of 2017, advances have been made in hardware and computing to assist the ability of NOAA scientists to predict the path of storms and warn those who may be in harm's way.

Forecasters predict a 70% likelihood of 10-16 named storms (winds of 39 mph of higher), of which 5-9 could become hurricanes (winds 74 mph or higher), and 1-4 major hurricanes (Category 3, 4, or 5; winds of 111 mph or higher). The average hurricane season produces 12 named storms of which 6 become hurricanes, including 3 major hurricanes.
