SEPTEMBER MEETING:

Our first meeting of the season will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September</u> <u>23, 2015</u> hosted by the National Fire Protection Association, One Batterymarch Park, Quincy. MIFDI was last hosted at NFPA for our January 2012 meeting. We are scheduled to meet in the Board Room.

Our host will be NFPA Fire Protection Engineer Jacqueline Wilmot with a fascination presentation on the hazards associated with mobile food trucks. 

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

Restaurant Hood Cleaning

The Office of the Massachusetts State Fire Marshal recently released a memorandum regarding restaurant hood cleaning. The investigation of several fires in Massachusetts at chain-type restaurants showed that a common factor in these fires has been that the hood and duct system have been cleaned and inspected by companies whose employees do not hold a *Certificate of Competency* issued by the Fire Marshal.

Some of these restaurants are owned by corporations or franchises located out of state and are unfamiliar with the hood cleaning and inspection requirements contained in 527 CMR 1.00 Chapter 50.

The Fire Marshal therefore asks that we ensure that restaurant operators in our communities are aware of the requirement that hood cleaners hold a *Certificate of Competency* issued by the Fire Marshal and comply with 527 CMR 1.00.
