

OCTOBER MEETING:.

The October meeting MIFDI will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>October 28</u>, <u>2015</u>. We will be hosted by the Middlesex County Sheriff's Office, Billerica House of Correction located at 269 Treble Cove Rd, Billerica courtesy of Sheriff Peter Koutoujian. Our presenter will be Captain Bill Buckley with a presentation on "Responding to emergencies in correctional facilities".

Although many of our communities do not house prisons, we may be called to communities on mutual aid and respond to fires or EMS runs in a correctional facility, communities such as Boston, Billerica, Concord, Dedham, Framingham, Norfolk, Walpole, Salem, just to name a few. This will be a rare opportunity for many of us to see firsthand what these facilities are about and to think about how difficult a serious fire in a prison would challenge our firefighters.

There are a few logistic issues for those planning to attend. If you have a fire department I.D., be sure to bring it along with your driver's license. ALSO, tobacco products of any kind are considered contraband as well as matches, lighters, work knives, medications, etc. The less you carry the better. Leave all unnecessary items in your vehicles and lock your car.

SCHEDULE: 0930-1000 arrival, 1000 Presentation & facility tour, 1200 lunch will be provided.

DIRECTIONS: From Rt.128 or 495, take Rt. 3 to Exit 28. Turn on Treble Cove Rd towards West Billerica a short distance and the House of Corrections will be on your right. Park in the visitor's lot on the left after entering the main entrance. From the parking lot, walk up to the visitors center/checkpoint building at the top of the driveway (Red brick building with white trim). From there we will be shuttled up to the Podular Building for our meeting in the conference room for the presentation followed by a tour of the facility.



REPORT of the PRESIDENT:

Captain Mark W. Roche, Newton Fire Department

Our September meeting held at the headquarters of the National Fire Prevention Association in Quincy provided us with an important presentation on Mobile Food Truck Safety. I thank Jacqueline Wilmot of NFPA for this informative program and bringing awareness to communities regarding the hazards associated with mobile food trucks. I thank NFPA President Jim Pauley for hosting MIFDI at NFPA and special thanks to Rich Bielen of NFPA for assisting with the arrangements for our meeting.

On September 19, I was honored to represent MIFDI at the funeral service in Salem for former State Fire Marshal Joseph A. O'Keefe who died on September 14 at age 82. Joe was appointed Fire Marshall in 1977 by Governor Michael Dukakis and served in the position until his retirement in 1992. Joe was instrumental in the establishment of the Fire Science program and taught at both Bunker Hill Community College and North Shore Community College. As stated in his obituary: "Joe served with great dignity and respect putting the safety and welfare of firefighters and the residents of the Commonwealth first and foremost in all his endeavors". We thank him for his dedication and contributions to the fire service.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

Protect Yourself Against Cancer

Use SCBA from initial attack until overhaul is completed and atmosphere is monitored. (Not wearing SCBA in both active and post-fire environments is the most dangerous voluntary activity in the fire service today).

Do gross field decon of PPE to remove as much soot and particles as possible.

Use wet-nap or baby wipes to remove as much soot as possible from head, neck, jaw, throat, underarms, and hands immediately.

Change your clothes and wash them immediately after a fire.

Shower thoroughly after a fire.

Clean your PPE, gloves, hood, and helmet immediately after a fire.

Do not take contaminated clothes or PPE home or store in your vehicle.

Decon the interior of fire apparatus after fires.

Keep bunker gear out of living areas and sleeping quarters.

Stop the use of all tobacco products.

Use sunscreen or sun block when outdoors.

The importance of annual medical examinations cannot be overstated. Early detection and early treatment are essential to increasing survival.

FIREFIGHTERS ARE EXPOSED THROUGH THE FOLLOWING; Ingestion, Inhalation, Absorption (Groin-300%, Jaw-93%, Head 43%)

For every 5-degree increase in skin temperature, body absorption increases 400%
