





INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

How Safe Are Your Dorms?

According to the U.S. Department of Education, there are approximately 18 million students enrolled in 4100 colleges and universities across the country, (approximately two-thirds live in off campus housing). According to information compiled by Campus Firewatch, 86 percent of the college fire fatalities across the nation have occurred in off campus housing. Five common factors in a number of these fires include; lack of a fire sprinkler system, missing or disabled smoke detectors, improper disposal of smoking materials, impaired judgment due to alcohol consumption, and fires originating on upholstered furniture on decks or porches. From January 2000 to present, 89 fatal fires have been documented that have occurred on a college campus, in "Greek Housing", or in off-campus housing within 3-miles of the campus, claiming a total of 126 victims (Greek Housing is a fraternity or sorority house).

(MIFDI Presidents Note)

In Massachusetts, students travel from all over the world to attend our many prestigious colleges and universities. We in the fire service are required to inspect all of our college dorm buildings at least annually, and those companies assigned in districts with college dorms are all too familiar with responses to these locations for "nuisance alarms" such as burnt popcorn at 2am, maliciously discharged fire extinguishers, and of course the pull station false alarms.

Do we know the locations of the off-campus housing? Many are three-decker's or old converted Victorian structures cut-up into a maze of single bedrooms to house dozens of students to share the expenses of the housing. It is doubtful that we will find a suppression system in these structures and it is likely that whatever detection systems are installed will be dismantled at some point.

We must work closely with our local Inspectional Services Departments to be notified of the locations of off-campus housing in our communities. We should also maintain a good working relationship with the college Fire Safety Officers to ensure that the dormitory detection and suppression systems are maintained, and that students are fined for dismantling smoke detectors in their rooms.

Finally, student vacation weeks and holiday breaks are a good opportunity for our companies to pre-fire plan and run a dry line from a standpipe get an idea of the stretch between stairways. It is also a good time to check damage to threads debris in the piping, missing caps, reducers, handles, etc. Most importantly, we must be aware of security screens on windows that could prevent entry or escape during firefighting operations.
