



RECALL OF MEETING #2016-08

October MIFDI Meeting Brockton Historical Society, Brockton, MA October 26, 2016

President Roche opened the meeting at 10:00. He thanked the Brockton Historical Society for their hospitality and then introduced this month's speaker/presenter, Brockton Fire Chief Kevin Galligan (Ret.). Chief Galligan gave a great, albeit shortened, version of his presentation of 2 ½ Story Dwelling Fires. Copies of the handouts can be obtained by either Chief Galligan or Secretary Quinn. The Chief brought up many aspects of Incident Command Responsibilities, Strategic and Tactical Guides, as well as water supply considerations; too many to rely in this short report. After the presentation, President Roche gave Chief Galligan a \$100 donation from MIFDI for the Brockton Fire Museum, which is located on the same property.

President Roche then offered a moment of silence for Francis Cahill. There was no Vice-president report or Treasurer's report.

Andy Connerty gave a report from the MA Fire Training Council. Andy answered some questions regarding the difficulty and/or failure rate at the MFA with regards to the new curriculum. It appears that the issues surrounding the have worked out. Andy also reports that there is still no new director at the Academy and helped explain the inner working of the financial part of the funding at the DFS and MFA. John O'Donahue spoke on the Elevator Code and that they are in their final stages of the 2013 Code.

Before adjoining, Chief Galligan spoke on the history of the Brockton Fire Museum (if you have not gone there before, it is certainly a must see).

Motion to adjoin and libations were had at the Chateau. The next meeting is on November 30th and will be in Wilmington at the Public Safety Building. The topic will be PPE and the care and cleaning of it.

EMS Run

Boston EMS Attack

During the midnight shift on October 30, 2016, Boston EMS responded for a Psychiatric emergency involving a male age 31 at his mother's south End apartment. The man had a history of Paranoid Schizophrenia. Shortly after arriving, EMS members, police and the individual's family were attempting to calm the man and convince to him to go to the hospital. Suddenly the distraught man pulled out a knife and threatened police and EMS members. After a violent struggle in attempt to retrieve the weapon, police were forced to shoot the attacker who later died.

The two EMT's suffered head and back injuries during the attack and were transported to the hospital. Although the man's family criticized police for the shooting, the EMT's credited police with saving their lives.

PRESIDENTS NOTE: It appears that we are responding to an increased number of "Psyche Calls" since the de-institutionalization of people with a history of psychiatric behavior. Although these calls are getting more routine and considered by some as a "nuisance call", the fact is that these people need help and their families are at the end of their rope when they get to the point of calling 9-1-1. The problem for us is that many individuals with psychiatric issues can turn against us in an instant and attack us without warning. We must always make certain that police are on scene before we enter to ensure that the scene is safe and NEVER let your guard down!

INSTRUCTORS CORNER:

Risk of Impact Injuries from Top-Load Washing Machines

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission announced the recall of Samsung top-load washing machines due to the risk of impact injuries. The washing machine top can unexpectedly and forcefully detach from the washing machine chassis during use posing a risk of injury.

The recall involves 34 models of Samsung top-load washing machines. The washing machines have mid-controls or rear-controls. Model numbers and serial information can be located on two labels affixed to the back of the machine.

Samsung received 733 reports of washing machines experiencing excessive vibration or the top detaching from the chassis. There are nine related reports of injuries, including a broken jaw, injured shoulder, and other impact or fall related injuries.

PRESIDENT'S NOTE: Firefighters should be aware of this household hazard when responding to a report of a loud vibration or explosion in the basement, do not always assume the explosion to be a delayed ignition in the oil burner. Precaution should be taken when approaching these washers when in operation. Immediately shut down the unit and disconnect the power. At least if you come across an incident of an "exploding washer", you will have a better understanding of what may have happened and you can ask the homeowner "Is this a Samsung washer?"
