



MARCH MEETING

The March meeting of MIFDI will be held on <u>Wednesday, March 25, 2020.</u> We will be hosted by the Massachusetts Department of Fire Services and the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy courtesy of State Fire Marshal Peter Ostroskey. We will meet in Classroom 127 (Check the welcome screen in the lobby in the event of a room location change).

The training program will be provided by Firefighter Daniel Rinaldi of the Providence Fire Department. Dan will share a terrifying experience and lesions learned after a "MAYDAY" during a structure fire. Dan's program has been very well received in previous presentations and is a must see for every member of the fire service.

SCHEDULE:

0900: Coffee (Available in the cafeteria), **1000:** Presentation, **1130:** Business meeting,

1200: Lunch (In the facility cafeteria on site).

DIRECTIONS:

FROM RT.128/I 95: Take Rt. 20 West to Rt. 27 in Wayland. Turn right on Rt. 27 and continue until Rt. 27 makes a right towards Maynard, *DO NOT TURN RIGHT*, continue straight for aprox 3-miles and the Academy will be on the right.

FROM RT. 495 North: Take Rt. 85 (Exit 25) towards Hudson. At the traffic light turn left onto Rt.85. Turn right on Broad St. (First traffic light), and at the second traffic light turn right on Rt.62. Continue straight until Rt. 62 takes a left towards Stow, *DO NOT TURN LEFT*, continue straight for aprox 4-miles and the Academy will be on your left.

FROM RT. 495 South: Take Rt.62 (Exit 26) into Hudson Center. Continue halfway around the rotary and continue on Rt.62 East. Continue straight until Rt.62 turns left towards Stow, *DO NOT TURN LEFT*, continue straight for aprox 4-miles and the Academy will be on your left.

Ample parking is available in the upper-lot on the "D-Side" of the MFA campus.

RECALL OF MEETING #2020-02

The February meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday, February 26, 2020 hosted by the Wayland Fire Department courtesy of Chief Neil McPherson.

Our training program was provided by Kelly Hegarty, Crisis Intervention Responder for the Framingham Fire Department. Kelly's program focused on HOARDING and the hazards presented to firefighters when responding to these locations, (We all have them in our communities). The hoarding disorder is a mental health condition which affects 4-6% of the population. Only 26% of "Heavy Content" homes have working smoke detectors and the average damage during fires in these structures is significantly greater. Fighting fires at these locations put firefighters at greater risk due to the heavy fire load and the possibility of piles of items falling over and trapping members. When the occupants are accounted for, the Incident Commander must make the tactical decision on whether to go offensive or defensive weighing the risk vs. benefit.

Following the program, President Roche conducted a brief business meeting. Chief McPherson was introduced and welcomed MIFDI. New member, Deputy Chief David Hayes from Norwood was introduced. Member Andy Connerty was congratulated upon his recent promotion to Assistant Chief of the Burlington Fire Department. Andy then provided an update from the Mass Fire Training Council meeting. Richard Ripley spoke briefly about Lynnfield responding to a recent fatal fire in Reading. Bob MacKendrick spoke on various fire prevention topics. President Roche made mention of the upcoming FCAM Conference & Expo at the DCU Center in Worcester.

Members adjourned for lunch at "The Local Restaurant" in Wayland



Page 5 <u>EMS Run</u> *COVID-19 Update*

As of this writing there have been 28 cases of COVID-19 in Massachusetts, 1 confirmed positive and 27 "presumptive". These numbers are expected to rise each week. Scientists throughout the world are reported to be close to eradicating this virus. The following is an update from the IAFF to protect members and the public when responding to potential COVID-19 incidents;

- Dispatch call takers must inquire about flu-like symptoms, recent travel or exposure. If a patient is showing signs of flu-like symptoms, regardless of travel, dispatchers must provide instructions of "<u>PPE Advised</u>" to responding personnel.
- When responding to a potential COVID-19 incident, members must wear appropriate PPE including; N-95 mask, gloves eye protection and placement of a surgical mask on the patient. Document all potential or confirmed exposures in accordance with your Department Exposure Reports.
- Follow CDC recommendations on cleaning and disinfection of EMS vehicles, PPE and equipment after transporting a patient with confirmed COVID-19.
- Insure that your department has an adequate inventory of CDC recommended PPE and monitor the availability of PPE
 - with medical supply venders.

If a member is exposed to a confirmed positive COVID-19 patient, a member must enter a 14-day quarantine to monitor

for signs & symptoms of the virus. CDC recommends exposed individuals await the onset of symptoms (fever,

cough, respiratory difficulty, etc) prior to being tested. If the test results are negative, the member must remain in quarantine for the full 14-days. If it is positive, the member must be moved to isolation.

Fire departments must work closely with local health

- departments to establish testing protocols. The test is a nasal and throat swab. The CDC recommends the test be
- performed only on patients who are presenting with signs of the virus.


