





# Reflective Markings May Decrease First Responder Visibility

A new study suggests that the presence of very highly reflective markings may decrease drivers' ability to see first responders working adjacent to their vehicles. On March 3, 2022, The U.S. Fire Administration published a new study from the Emergency Responder Safety Institute (ERSI) on their website. One significant variable impacting the safety of responders operating along a roadway is their visibility to approaching and passing motorists, especially at night. Warning lights and reflective materials on vehicles and clothing are typically employed at the scene to ensure visibility. The study investigated the impact of lighting color, intensity, modulation and flash rate on driver behavior while passing a traffic incident scene at night. # **INSTRUCTORS CORNER:**

## Tesla MVA & Fire

Interesting post found recently. On March 10, a Tesla was involved in a single vehicle accident causing front end damage and igniting on fire. The injured were treated and transported as the vehicle became engulfed with fire. The fire department reported using 4000 gallons of water to initially extinguish the fire.

The photo below is from the tow lot where the vehicle was taken. Within the five days of the incident, the vehicle battery burned THREE additional times requiring a fire department response each time (Note the battery on the undercarriage). At one point, the tow company flipped the vehicle over to allow the fire department better access to cool the battery. Apparent thermal run-away caused the battery to heat up and reignite in spite of the additional thousand gallons of water applied.

A routine auto fire can usually be extinguished with the typical tank water of 500-750 gallons of water. These new battery powered vehicles will be a significant challenge for the fire service in the future as the country heads towards reduced use of fossil fuels. Until an effective suppression agent is developed for these vehicles, the current recommendation would be to secure a constant water supply from a hydrant, lake or water tanker to constantly cool the battery and protect nearby combustible exposures.

MIFDI encourages feedback from members regarding extinguishment options for these vehicles.
