

RECALL OF MEETING #2022-05

The May meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday May 25, 2022 hosted by the Wilmington Fire Department courtesy of Chief William Cavanaugh. The meeting was held in the Training Room of the Wilmington Public Safety Building

The training program was provided by MIFDI P.P. Norm Aubert. Norm offered a fascinating presentation titled; **TAKING ACTION AGAINST CANCER IN THE FIRE SERVICE**. This informative program is offered through the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy for fire departments throughout the Commonwealth. We were grateful to have this shared with MIFDI members.

Following the program, a brief business meeting was conducted beginning with a moment of silence for the victims of the school shooting in Uvalde TX. One new member was introduced. Condolences were offered to members Jim & Brien Belliveau of the recent loss of their mother Jean. Condolences were also offered to member Bob MacKendrick of the loss of his father Harlan at age 102. MFTC Rep. Andy Connerty reported that Chief Tim Nelson from Amherst has been selected as the new Chairman of the Massachusetts Fire Training Council due to the retirement in April of Lt. Paul Medeiros from Hyannis. Members adjourned to lunch at nearby Rocco's Restaurant.

Fire fighter occupational cancer is the leading cause of line-of-duty deaths in the fire service.

Monkeypox?

According to the CDC, scientists are tracking cases of monkeypox in countries that don't normally have monkeypox, including the United States. As of this writing, there are 12 cases reported in the US including one in Massachusetts.

It is not clear how individuals were exposed to monkeypox but the CDC is urging healthcare providers in the US to be alert for patients with rash illnesses. Some of the red flags include anyone who;

Traveled to West Africa or parts of Europe where monkeypox has been reported.

Have had contact with a person confirmed or suspected with monkeypox. Is a man who had intimate contact with other men.

The symptoms of monkeypox are similar but milder than symptoms of smallpox. The main difference is that monkeypox causes the lymph nodes to swell, smallpox does not. The illness begins with: FEVER, HEADACHE, MUSTLE ACHES, BACKACHE, SWOLLEN LYMPHNODES, CHILLS, EXHAUSTION.

Within 1-3 days of the fever, the patient develops a rash beginning on the face and then spreading to other parts of the body. LESIONS will then progress throughout the body before turning to scabs and falling off. The illness can last 2-4 weeks.

Transmission of the virus occurs when a person comes in contact with the virus from an animal, human, or contaminated materials with the virus. The virus enters the body through broken skin, respiratory tract, or mucous membranes.

The key to prevention for us as EMS First Responders is the same as we have become accustomed to when dealing with COVID: Practice good hygiene by washing with soap and water and use alcohol-based hand sanitizer. **MOST IMPORTANTLY**, use PPE including masks, gloves, eye protection and gowns when handling infected patients.

Currently there is no specific treatment for the monkeypox virus infection. The antiviral developed for patients with smallpox may prove to be beneficial with treating monkeypox. Massachusetts General Hospital is one of the first medical facilities in the country to currently research a treatment for monkeypox.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER (Hurricane Season 2022)

The Atlantic Hurricane Season runs from June 1 through November 30.

According to the National Weather Service - NOAA Climate Prediction Center, the 2022 Hurricane Season could possibly be the 7th above average season on record with;

- 14-21 Named Storms (Winds 39 mph or higher)
- 6-10 could become hurricanes (Winds 74 mph or higher)
- 3-6 could be major, Category 3,4,5 (Winds 111 mph or higher)
