RECALL OF MEETING #2022-06

The June meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday June 22, 2022 hosted by the Lexington Fire Department courtesy of Chief Derek Secabaugh. The meeting was held in the Training Room of Lexington Fire HQ.

The training program was provided by MIFDI Treasurer/P.P. Michael McLeieer. The presentation offered were highlights from the FDIC 2022 Expo. Members in attendance were provided with a zip-drive which included some of the important training presentations offered from the 2022 Training Conference.

Following the program, a brief business meeting was conducted beginning with a moment of silence for Philadelphia Fire Lt. Sean Williamson who died in the line-of-duty from a building collapse after a fire in a commercial structure on June 18. EMS Run

Suicide Prevention Month

September is "National Suicide Prevention Month", also known as "Suicide Awareness Month". We all know someone with a family member of this cruel mental health illness. Suicide affects everyone not just the victim, it impacts family and friends long after the loss of a loved one. There is an average of 123 suicide's each day in this country, the largest age group being 25-34. The majority of suicides are, not surprisingly, people suffering from depression.

Those of us as EMS first responders can remember every call for a suicide in our career, especially if it is a young person. They can also be very gruesome if the person has been hanging for a while or have used a shotgun to end their suffering. We take these calls home with us and try to bury the flashbacks of these incidents and the agony of seeing their loved ones hysterical upon finding the victim. We too are affected by these tragedies.

There appears to be an increase in EMS runs for mental health issues in the past few years. The pandemic as well as financial strains due to the economy have pushed people beyond their coping levels. Those diagnosed with terminal illness can be suicidal to end their suffering and to not burden family with long-term care for them. The bullying of children at school and on social media sites can create depression and thoughts of suicide with young people. Lost love or a person jilted by a lover has always been a trigger for suicide.

The focus of Suicide Awareness Month is to understand behavioral signs of those with suicidal thoughts. Identifying depression can be difficult, not all with depression show signs. People that do talk about killing themselves is a red flag to have them seek treatment before they act upon it.

Families can seek access to resources on suicide prevention through the "National Alliance on Mental Health Illness" website at www.nami.org The National Suicide Prevention Hotline is 800-273-TALK (8255). There is also a newly created "SUICIDE & CRISIS LIFELINE", those in need of help can now call "9-8-8"

INSTRUCTORS CORNER

School Bus Safety

Officers and apparatus drivers are again reminded to remain vigilant for school bus pick-up and discharge points in your districts when responding to incidents. Speed of apparatus must be reduced in designated areas along school bus routes and be aware of the last minute children running to catch the bus. Fire department drivers are reminded that they are subject to all Registry of Motor Vehicle Regulations.

CHAPTER 90 General Laws: When approaching a vehicle which displays a sign bearing the name SCHOOL BUS with front and rear signal lamps flashing and stopped to allow passengers to board or discharge, the apparatus driver shall bring the vehicle to a <u>COMPLETE STOP</u> (except on a divided highway), and shall not proceed until the warning lights are deactivated or directed to the contrary by the police or duly authorized traffic control officer.
