

RECALL OF MEETING #2022-12

The December meeting of MIFDI was our Annual Holiday Luncheon held on Wednesday December 21, 2022 at the Café Escadrille in Burlington. This MIFDI holiday gathering has now become a tradition for members to gather socially for the Christmas season as we close out another year.



EMS Run

Commotio Cordis

On the evening of January 2, 2023, football fans from across the country witnessed a frightening event during nationally televised football game in Cincinnati when Buffalo Bills football player Damar Hamlin collapsed on the field in cardiac arrest after blow to the chest.

When a person is struck in the chest at a specific millisecond of the heart rhythm cycle, the electrical system in the heart can be interrupted resulting in ventricular fibrillation and cardiac arrest. This rare phenomenon is known as "Commotio Cordis" which is caused by a blow to the chest from a baseball/softball, hockey puck or a tackle during football. Young people are at a higher risk due to less development of the chest wall allowing force to be more easily transmitted to the heart.

Symptoms can include; lack of pulse, not breathing or gasping, possible jerking motions of extremities similar to a seizure. Once it is determined that the unconscious person is not breathing and without a pulse, CPR must begin immediately along with applying an AED. A shock should be delivered as soon as instructed by the prompt on the AED. It is important that an AED shock is given to the victim within 3-minutes of the collapse. For every minute that it takes to apply an AED on a victim, they lose a 10% chance of survival.

In 2014, Massachusetts passed "Michael's Law" to improve EMS at schools and sporting events within the Commonwealth. This law was spearheaded by the parents of a 16-year old from Sutton who died suddenly during a high school football game in 2011.

The important reminder of these incidents is that when called to an "unknown medical" to a sports event at a field, stadium or arena, don't assume the usual fracture or dislocation, prepare for the worst. The best chance for survival is immediate CPR along with an AED, just ask the family of Damar Hamlin.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER

Cancer Awareness & Prevention



Use SCBA from initial attack until overhaul is completed and atmosphere is monitored. (Not wearing SCBA in both active and post-fire environments is the most dangerous voluntary activity in the fire service today).

Do gross field decon of PPE to remove as much soot and particles as possible.

Use wet-nap or baby wipes to remove as much soot as possible from head, neck, jaw, throat, underarms, and hands immediately.

Change your clothes and wash them immediately after a fire. Shower thoroughly after a fire.

Clean your PPE, gloves, hood, and helmet immediately after a fire. Do not take contaminated clothes or PPE home or store in your vehicle.

Decon the interior of fire apparatus after fires. Keep bunker gear out of living areas and sleeping quarters. Stop the use of all tobacco products.

The importance of annual medical examinations cannot be overstated. Early detection and early treatment are essential to increasing survival.

FIREFIGHTERS ARE EXPOSED THROUGH THE FOLLOWING; Ingestion, Inhalation, Absorption (Groin-300%, Jaw-93%, Head 43%)

For every 5-degree increase in skin temperature, body absorption increases 400%
