



EMS Run Reminders about C.O. hazards during the winter heating season

Carbon Monoxide

What is carbon monoxide?

- · Carbon monoxide, or CO, is an invisible gas
- · It is made when things are burned
- · You can't see, smell, or taste carbon monoxide

Why is CO dangerous?

- · You may not realize you are breathing CO
- CO prevents your blood from carrying enough oxygen through your body
- · Exposure can be fatal
- · CO can harm or kill anyone, but children, pregnant women, and people who have heart disease are most at risk for CO poisoning

Common sources of CO:

- · Gas- & propane-fueled grills · Gas stoves &
- · Fireplaces & furnaces appliances
- · Gas/oil-fueled space heaters · Car exhaust

If the CO detector goes off...

- · Call 911 right away
- · Contact a technician to inspect your CO detector, gas and heating appliances
- · Re-enter your home when emergency services has indicated that its safe





- · Fainting & dizziness Vomiting
- · Shortness of breath Headaches
- Weakness · Feeling drowsy

To protect yourself from CO poisoning...

- Leave your home and get fresh air outdoors
 Install carbon monoxide detectors in your home. Change the batteries every 6 months.
 - · Clean your fireplace and chimney every year
 - · Have your heating system cleaned and inspected every year
 - · Make sure your car's tailpipe and furnace vents are clear of snow
 - · Do NOT use a gas stove or oven to heat your home
 - · Do NOT warm your car in the garage
 - · Do NOT use gas-fueled space heaters in spaces that are not ventilated
 - · Do NOT store items close to your home's appliance/heating system room

INSTRUCTORS CORNER

Another Tesla Fire/ Another Challenge

On the night of January 19, 2023, the Wakefield Fire Department responded to a single vehicle MVA on the northbound side of I-95 at Exit 59. What began as a routine MVA with no injuries soon escalated to a TWO-HOUR incident.

The auto involved in this accident was, you guessed it, a Tesla electric vehicle. As the vehicle was in the process of being removed, the guardrail ripped the undercarriage battery tray creating a "thermal runaway" of the lithium-ion batteries causing the Tesla to soon become fully involved.

A full box alarm assignment was requested by the I.C. for additional resources. As the need for a supplementary water supply became evident, mutual aid from surrounding communities was dispatched. A Lynnfield engine established an LDH supply line from an adjacent street. It took 2-hours to place the fire under control with over 20,000 gallons of water used to extinguish this EV fire.

NOTE: There have been some dangerous training tips on social media regarding strategies during electric vehicle fires, some tactics can be dangerous or deadly. **REMEMBER**:

If it's an MVA or car fire, once it is determined to be an EV, prepare for the worst. Stay up-wind with full PPE and call for enough resources early.

Look for water source(s) and establish a continuous water supply.

Prepare for a long duration incident, rotate crews if necessary.

Notify the DFS HAZ-MAT Team for guidance if the batteries detach from underside.

NEVER drill holes in the EV batteries which are overheated or on fire. If safe to do so, prop the vehicle to a 45-degree angle to access the battery tray. Large quantities of water are required to cool the undercarriage battery tray. Foam is ineffective on EV fires; it will contain the heat and not cool the battery tray.

Notify the State DEP about the run-off of contaminated water. Find out the location of the tow lot and have it located in an open area.
