RECALL OF MEETING #2023-3

The March meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday March 22, 2023 hosted by the Massachusetts Department of Fire Services at the Stow Campus of the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy.

We were welcomed by State Fire Marshal Peter Ostroskey. The Marshal mentioned his upcoming retirement scheduled for the end of June. He also spoke on many of the improvements at the three fire academy sites with additional buildings and props planned for the Bridgewater campus in the near future.

Following Marshal Ostroskey, we were presented with an overview of the "Quick Reference Legal Guides for the Fire Service" by DFS Legal Council Glenn Rooney. Glenn walked us through the various prepared guides and answered many of our questions regarding possible litigations involving the fire service.

Finally we were greeted by the new MFA Director Jeffrey Winn. Director Winn was appointed to the position in January and provided us with his career background and ideas for improving upon certain areas of recruit firefighter health & safety issues. He is hopeful that the recruit training program will soon return to 4-classes per year to reduce the wait list time for new firefighters.



INSTRUCTORS CORNER

Lawmakers n Virginia recently passed House Bill 2451 to require the Executive Director of the Department of Fire Programs to develop a training program for all firefighters, including volunteers, about the risks and hazards of fires involving electric vehicles. The program must be developed by July 1, 2024 and training must be completed by December 1, 2025. The training plan will make the program available as an online version or as in-person training. A workgroup will be established to create the curriculum which will then be piloted and finalized for posting.

The number of electric vehicles on the road is expected to dramatically increase in the future. As of the First Quarter of 2023, Tesla reported that deliveries of their EV's were 422,875. Currently fire departments can seek out training from auto manufacturers such as Tesla or Toyota.

Firefighters throughout the world are working on ways to deal with this growing new challenge. A fire involving a vehicle with an internal combustion engine generally uses 100-200 gallons of water to extinguish, a fire in an electric vehicle can require up to 10,000 gallons of water and still reignite on the way to the tow yard if the battery packs on the undercarriage are not properly cooled. Some vehicle batteries will reignite two-three days later due to overheating of the lithium-ion batteries from a reaction known as thermal runaway.

As mentioned before, the best recommendation is water according to the NFPA. Water will extinguish the fire and cool the heat from the battery pack.
