

<u>REPORT of the PRESIDENT:</u> Captain Mark W. Roche (Ret), Newton Fire Department

Our April meeting was another informative presentation on Pipeline Safety Training for First Responders. I thank our presenter and the representatives from ENBRIDGE Energy for providing this important training.

Another tragedy struck again for our Brothers in Blue on April 26, 2024 when Billerica Police Sgt. Ian Taylor died from injuries after being struck by a construction vehicle while working a road detail. This tragic incident comes less than 4-months after Waltham Police Officer Paul Tracey was struck and killed while working a detail on December 6, 2023. When we as firefighters respond to these horrific incidents, it becomes even worse when we realize that it is a public safety professional and most likely it is someone that we know. Our hearts go out to the members of the Billerica Police Department, Billerica Fire Department and Billerica EMS with hope that they will find comfort among each other with the healing process in the weeks and months ahead.

INSTRUCTORS CORNER Increase in Lithium-Ion Battery Fires

According to the Massachusetts Department of Fire Services, a new tracking tool has identified 50 fires attributed to lithium-ion batteries during the past 6-months. The new DFS Lithium-Ion battery fire checklist was launched last October to create a database for identifying patterns and trends. Local fire departments are urged to adopt this new checklist when a lithium-ion battery is suspected as a cause.

Lithium-ion battery fires have been reported in 38 communities. Nine of these involved devices including battery powered scooters, e-bikes, and hover-boards making them the most common involved in fires. Lithium-ion batteries also power small devices such as e-cigarettes, laptops, smart-phones, tablets and cordless power tools. If they are overcharged, overheated or damaged, they can fail rapidly with no warning. If the battery goes into thermal runaway it will erupt with explosive toxic gases and flames which will ignite nearby combustibles. Water and traditional fire extinguishers are significantly less effective against lithium-ion battery fires.

The following safety tips are recommended by DFS to prevent lithium-ion battery fires:

- Use only manufacturer's batteries and chargers. After market products may be less expensive but more likely to cause a failure
- Store scooters, and e-bikes outdoors. It they must be stored inside, keep them clear of doors windows and stairways.
- Charge the battery direct from an outlet, not from an extension cord or power strip. Place the charger on a hard stable surface, never on a bed, couch or pillow.
- Charge only one battery or device at a time and unplug it after it's fully charged. Never continue charging a a fully charged battery.
- If there are changes to the battery/device such as damage, unusual odor, change in color or shape, too much heat, leaking, smoking or failure to keep a charge, discontinue using it.
- Finally, never throw the battery in the trash. They must be recycled or returned to the place of purchase for proper disposal.
