MEETING NOTICE

The September meeting of MIFDI will be held on <u>Wednesday. September</u> <u>25, 2024</u> hosted by the Needham Fire Department courtesy of Chief Thomas Conroy and Assistant Chief Donald Anastasi. We will meet in the training room at the new Public Safety Building, 88 Chestnut St. (Enter from the A/Dside of the building) MIFDI last met in Needham 10-years ago for our September 2014 meeting.

Our training will be a presentation on the Turtle Fire System nozzle designed for fires involving electric vehicles. This system with a low-profile design is deployed under the vehicle to deliver a large amount of water to the undercarriage directly onto the EV battery storage case. The second session of our training will be on "Traffic Management" for safe operations when dealing with incidents on highways. Special thanks to Pat O'Conner of Northeast Rescue Systems for arranging these presentations.

SCHEDULE:

0930: Coffee, 1000: Presentations, 1130: Business Meeting, 1200: Lunch (Off site)

DIRECTIONS:

From the North, take Rt.128/I-95 south to Exit 35C (Highland Ave). Follow Highland Ave 5-traffic lights. At the 5th light, bear right onto Chapel St. When you cross Great Plain Ave. you are on Chestnut St and the fire station is on the left.

From the South, take Rt.128/I-95 north to Exit 32 (Rt.135). Follow Dedham Ave towards Needham. Turn left on School St when you see the "Blue H" hospital sign, after the 2nd stop sign the parking lot is on the right at Lincoln St.

NOTE: There is a parking lot in the rear of the Public Safety complex located at School & Lincoln Sts. Try to avoid the parking close to the station unless you have mobility issues to ensure that there is parking for those conducting fire department business.

RECALL OF MEETING #2024-06

The June meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday June 26, 2024 hosted by the Lexington Fire Department in their Training Room courtesy of Chief Derek Secabaugh.

The training program began with the introduction of Mark Foster, former Director of Massachusetts FEMA Task Force 1. Director Foster retired last November after serving for the past 31-years. He spoke briefly about his fascinating career and signed copies of his book titled "THE FIRST EIGHT DAYS AT GROUND ZERO".

The training continued with MIFDI Treasurer/ PP Michael McLeieer providing the annual recap of some of the highlights from the 2024 FDIC in Indianapolis. As always, Michael gave a great presentation and those in attendance were provided a zip-drive with some of the important topics covered for members to share the information with their respective departments.





EMS RUN Suicide Prevention Month

September is "National Suicide Prevention Month", also known as "Suicide Awareness Month". We all know someone with a family member of this cruel mental health illness. Suicide affects everyone not just the victim, it impacts family and friends long after the loss of a loved one. There is an average of 123 suicide's each day in this country, the largest age group being 25-34. The majority of suicides are, not surprisingly, people suffering from depression.

Those of us as EMS first responders can remember every call for a suicide in our career, especially if it is a young person. They can also be very gruesome if the person has been hanging for a while or have used a shotgun to end their suffering We take these calls home with us and try to bury the flashbacks of these incidents and the agony of seeing their loved ones hysterical upon finding the victim. We too are affected by these tragedies.

There appears to be an increase in EMS runs for mental health issues in the past few years. The financial strains due to the economy can push people beyond their coping levels. Those diagnosed with terminal illness can be suicidal to end their suffering and to not burden family with long-term care for them. The bullying of children at school and on social media sites can create depression and thoughts of suicide with young people. Lost love or a person jilted by a lover has always been a trigger for suicide.

The focus of Suicide Awareness Month is to understand behavioral signs of those with suicidal thoughts. Identifying depression can be difficult, not all with depression show signs. People that do talk about killing themselves are a red flag to have them seek treatment before they act upon it.

Families can seek access to resources on suicide prevention through the "National Alliance on Mental Health Illness" website at <u>www.nami.org</u> The National Suicide Prevention Hotline is <u>800-273-TALK (8255)</u>. There is also a newly created "SUICIDE & CRISIS LIFELINE"; those in need of help can now call "<u>9-8-8</u>"

INSTRUCTORS CORNER School Bus Safety Reminder

Officers and apparatus drivers are again reminded to remain vigilant for school bus pick-up and discharge points in your districts when responding to incidents. Speed of apparatus must be reduced in designated areas along school bus routes and be aware of the last minute children running to catch the bus. Fire department drivers are reminded that they are subject to all Registry of Motor Vehicle Regulations.

CHAPTER 90 General Laws: When approaching a vehicle which displays a sign bearing the name SCHOOL BUS with front and rear signal lamps flashing and stopped to allow passengers to board or discharge, the apparatus driver shall bring the vehicle to a <u>COMPLETE</u> <u>STOP</u> (except on a divided highway), and shall not proceed until the warning lights are deactivated or directed to the contrary by the police or duly authorized traffic control officer.
