# **RECALL OF MEETING #2024-11**

The November meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday November 20, 2024 hosted by the Canton Fire Department in the training room of their HQ Station at 99 Revere St.

The training program was provided by Leo Reardon, EMS Coordinator of the Canton Fire Department. Leo offered a very informative presentation of the new Regional Field Transfusion Paramedic Program launched in March 2024. This unit is the first of its kind on the East Coast to provide blood to critically injured trauma victims in a pre-hospital setting. This groundbreaking EMS unit has already contributed to saving the lives of 15 trauma patients.

Every Incident Commander must know that this unit is an important option when operating at an incident with a severely injured patient trapped and bleeding during a prolonged extrication, especially if it is an injured firefighter trapped and injured after a structural collapse. The FTP unit will respond upon request either directly to the incident or as an intercept for an EMS unit at a location enroute to a hospital. The intercept will be quick allowing the Field Transfusion Paramedics to board the ambulance with equipment and continue without delay to the hospital.

The Unit is dispatched through the Norfolk County Control Center. Your local Dispatch can call the Norfolk County Control Center directly or radio through your local Mutual Aid Control Center to contact Norfolk County and request the Canton FTP.

# Covid/Flu/RSV

Now that we are in the winter months, respiratory illnesses such as influenza (Flu) and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) are common during this time of the year. We can now add Covid-19 to this list of respiratory illnesses every year. All of these are highly contagious and present with similar symptoms including; fever, cough, shortness of breath, headache, runny nose, and generally feeling like crap. These respiratory illnesses can spread easily through contact or by coughing and sneezing.

Thankfully covid is no longer at the level of the pandemic, it does however continue to be a major health concern for the very young and the elderly population as well as those with serious health issues.

The important thing for us as first responders is to protect ourselves when responding to calls for respiratory distress. Always keep a mask in your pocket, wear medical gloves on all calls, use hand sanitizers after every call, clean your equipment with sanitizing wipes, and don't leave your dirty gloves on the floor of the apparatus!

# INSTRUCTORS CORNER What is "BERDO"

The term BERDO stands for "Building Emissions Reduction and Disclosure Ordinance". It is a locally imposed mandate for building owners to report energy consumption and report greenhouse gas emissions for state and federal emissions reduction goals. It is estimated that one-third of the carbon emissions in Massachusetts comes from buildings.

As of now, BERDO is only a local ordinance with a focus on large buildings for owners to report their annual energy and water consumption. The requirement also applies to public buildings as well. Thus far only Boston and Cambridge have this requirement in place with other communities expected to follow. BERDO applies to the following buildings; Residential buildings with 15 or more units, Nonresidential buildings 20,000 sq ft or larger, any parcel with multiple buildings that sum up to 20,000 sq ft or 15 units. The Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities (DPU) will most likely be the agency to oversee this requirement.

So why do we in the fire service need to know this? Actually we don't, however, it is important for us to understand what it is and what it means when asked about this requirement from citizens or developers during pre-planning and building inspections should your communities adopt the ordinance. It's always better to have the answers rather than the standard; "I'll have to get back to you on that".
