



# **EMS RUN**

#### Norovirus

According to the CDC, there has been a recent increase in Norovirus illnesses in the US. Norovirus is the leading cause of vomiting, diarrhea and food borne illness affecting people of all ages.

It is sometimes referred to as a "stomach flu" or "stomach bug" and is also very contagious. It is caused by the influenza virus and causes acute gastroenteritis which is an inflammation of the stomach or intestines. Most will recover within 1-3 days can still carry and spread the virus for a few days.

Symptoms usually develop 12-48 hours after exposure to the virus. The most common symptoms as mentioned are; diarrhea, vomiting, nausea, and stomach pain. Other symptoms include fever, headache and body aches.

Dehydration caused by loss of body fluids is the main concern of this illness, especially among young children and the elderly. Dehydration presents with decreased urination, dry mouth & throat, feeling dizzy when standing, crying without tears, unusual sleepiness.

Prevention includes washing hands often, cook shellfish thoroughly and wash fruits and vegetables, clean and disinfect surfaces, wash laundry in hot water, stay home when sick for 48 hours. Those affected are encouraged to drink plenty of fluids to replace fluid loss.

As MIFDI begins the New Year, I want to thank all of those who continue to support our important training organization throughout the years. That said, we remind our members to renew their annual dues to keep MIFDI operating for future fire department training officers. The dues remain at; ACTIVE \$35.00, RETIRED \$15.00, ASSOCIATE \$100. Dues can be paid at the meetings or mailed to MIFDI Treasurer, PO Box 507, Merrimac, MA 01860-0510.

Another reminder that meeting cancellations are strictly for the safety of our members and presenters. We use the same cancellation guideline as the Mass Fire Academy and we will post cancellations on the MIFDI website at <a href="https://www.mifdi.org">www.mifdi.org</a>

Finally, December continues to be a cruel month for the fire service every year. In Massachusetts we witnessed the tragic loss three young active members. Stay proactive about your health; physically, mentally and spiritually. January is Cancer Awareness Month, do yourself and your family a favor and schedule an appointment for a cancer screening, early detection is the best chance for survival. If you have not had a physical exam in a while, make it a point in 2025 to schedule one with your physician. There is now a simple and fast test called "Cardiac Calcium Score" that can determine any potential for blockages in the coronary arteries before it's too late. For those who served in the military and suffer from PTSD, reach out to the VA, they have a lot of experience with veterans suffering with this. If you are struggling with an addiction, reach out to your union for assistance, they are obligated to help members and have great resources for rehab through the PFFM and the IAFF. If you need help with stress or depression, reach out, there are plenty of organizations with 24 hour help lines to anonymously assist you with what you are dealing with. Don't hold it inside, there is nothing to be ashamed of, you are not alone as many people are suffering internally. Finally, if you notice that coworker has had a change in behavior or becoming quiet and isolated in the firehouse, ask them if they want to talk about it. Being part of a crew, we must all watch out for each other.

# INSTRUCTORS CORNER Cancer Awareness & Prevention



- Use SCBA from initial attack until overhaul is completed and atmosphere is monitored. (Not wearing SCBA in both active and post-fire environments is the most dangerous voluntary activity in the fire service today).
- Do gross field decon of PPE to remove as much soot and particles as possible.
- Use wet-nap or baby wipes to remove as much soot as possible from head, neck, jaw, throat, underarms, and hands immediately.
- Change your clothes and wash them immediately after a fire.
- Shower thoroughly after a fire.
- Clean your PPE, gloves, hood, and helmet immediately after a fire.
- Do not take contaminated clothes or PPE home or store in your vehicle.
- Clean the interior of fire apparatus after fires.
- Keep bunker gear out of living areas and sleeping quarters.
- Stop the use of all tobacco products.
