

RECALL OF MEETING #2025-02

The February meeting of MIFDI was held on Wednesday February 26, 2025 hosted by the Department of Fire Services at the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy – Stow Campus. We were greeted by Dean Babineau who welcomed MIFDI on behalf of Fire Marshal Jon Devine.

The training provided members an opportunity to look over the new mobile RIT trailer prop with a bailout demonstration by MFA Instructors. Following the RIT prop, we were then offered a look at the new mobile Incident Support Trailer which was also on display. Both of these new units are available for communities and are another great resource provided through DFS.





Page 5 <u>EMS RUN</u> *Handtevy System*

For those who have not heard of the Handtevy System, it was developed by an emergency room physician with the goal of improving care and outcomes of the pediatric patient during medical emergencies. The components include a first in bag dividing pediatric EMS equipment by size and age ranges.

The bag is multi-functional and organized with seven color-coded pouches following industry-standard age-based designations allowing swift identification of equipment sizes for the pediatric patient. The bag can be worn as a backpack, shoulder bag, or side grip handle.

There is also a smart phone app to assist providers with calculating appropriate doses of medication as well as defibrillation energy settings and proper sizes of medical equipment.



The Massachusetts Institute of Fire Department Instructors offers our condolences to the friends and family of the following:



REPORT of the PRESIDENT:



INSTRUCTORS CORNER *Are your hose loads secured?*

Recently there has been another report of hose dislodging from fire apparatus while responding to an incident in North Carolina. As the engine rounded the corner of a busy intersection, a line fell of the rig striking two people on the sidewalk. Both victims were transported to a local hospital with serious injuries. The apparatus driver is on Administrative Leave pending the results of the accident investigation.

As we all know, fire apparatus provides the greatest blanket of safety to our citizens more than any other agency in our community. A fire company is always there for help 24/7/365, not to cause injury or death to those we are trying to protect. These types of accidents are unacceptable and preventable with the exception of the failure of a bracket or equipment tie-down. Newer apparatus are equipped with secured canvas or netting over hose loads. The cargo netting proves to be very strong, durable and provides ventilation to the damp hose load. The only flaw with the netting, you <u>MUST</u> ensure that it is refastened after use. If this is not part of your daily apparatus checklist, it should be the responsibility of the driver to make sure the covers are secure during the morning apparatus check.

Dropping equipment on the road during a run is not only costly, it can and has caused damage to other vehicles and seriously injure innocent people on the street. It will also cause a delay to the original emergency that the company was responding to. A neatly packed hose bed not only looks nice, it is safer. The folds of the hose should not protrude beyond the hose bed. Nozzles should not be placed close to the edge but not exceeding an arm length in. The use rabbit ear loops should be avoided to keep the netting snug. If your hydrant gate is pre-connected and mounted on the rear-step, it should be securely fastened to avoid bouncing off and dropping the bed of feed-line down Main St!
